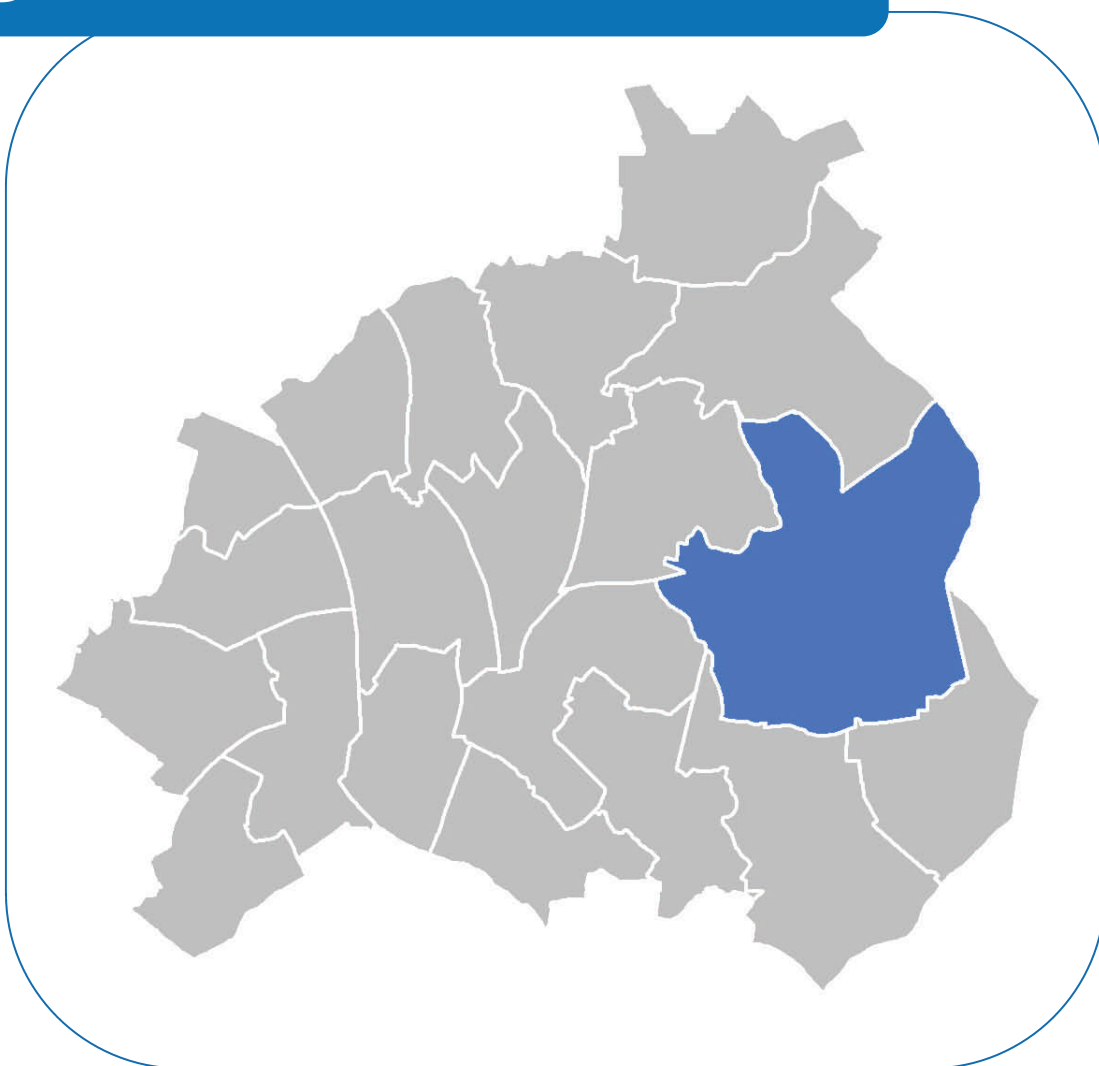

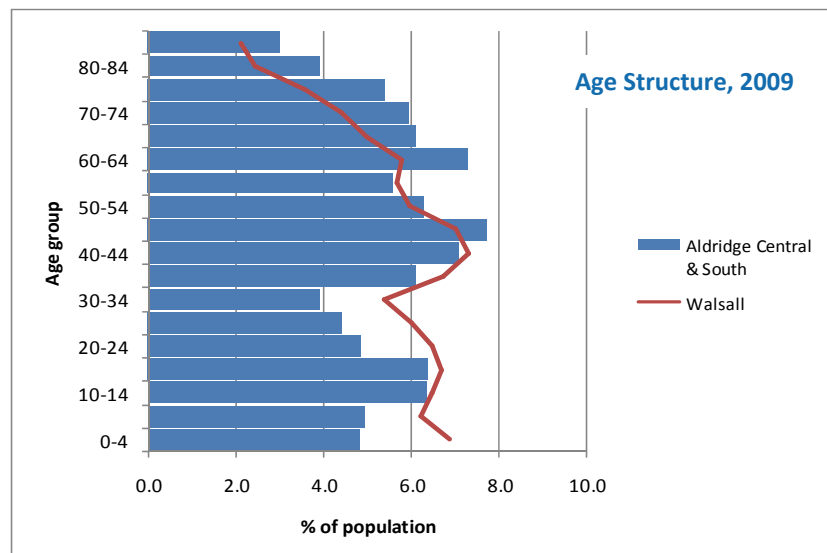

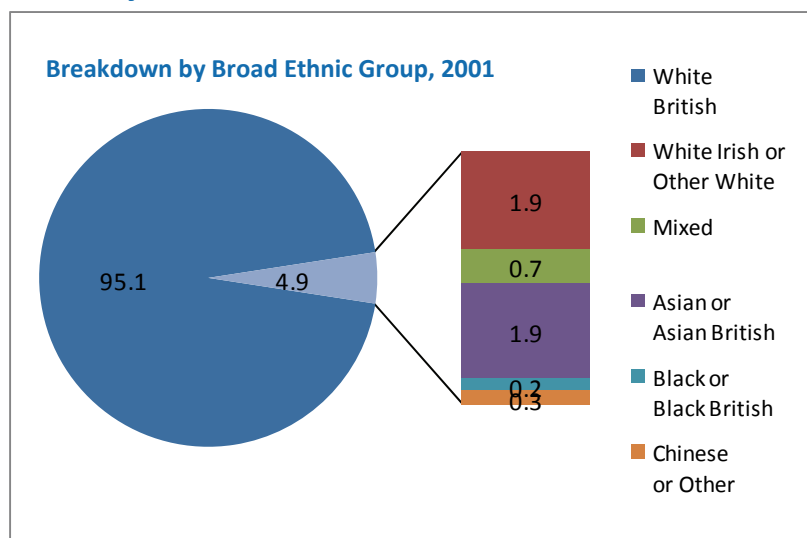
Where: **84.1%** of residents are satisfied with their local area as a place to live (Walsall = 71.4%)

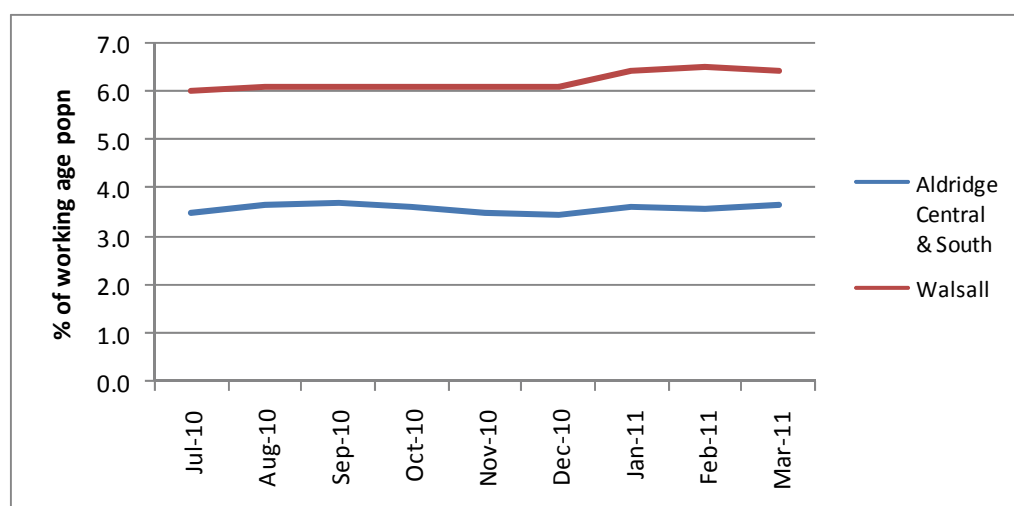

Jobseekers' Allowance claimants as a percentage of the total working age resident population (aged 16-64).

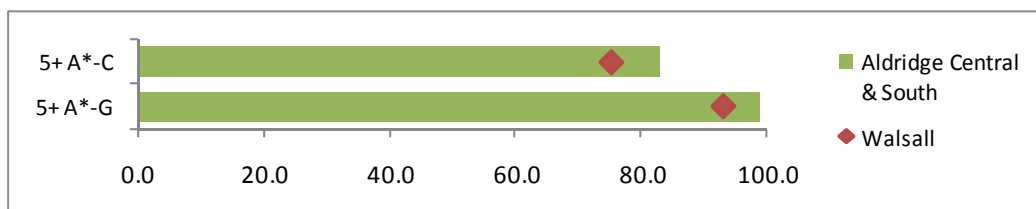

Chart (right) shows the percentage of GCSE candidates achieving 5 or more grades A*-C and A*-G.

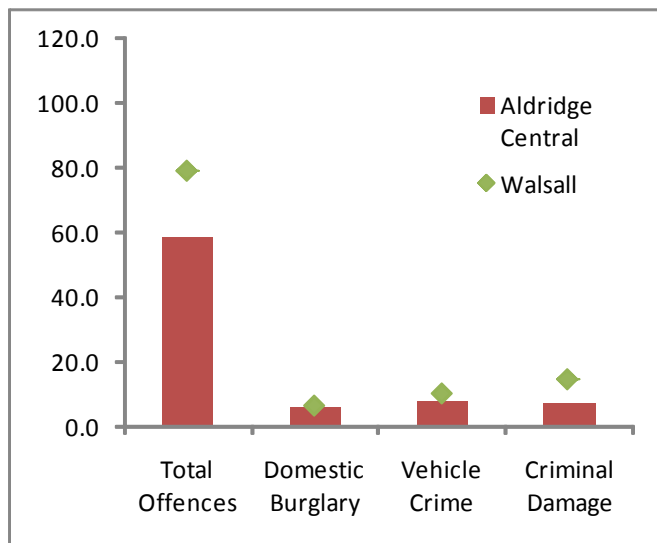

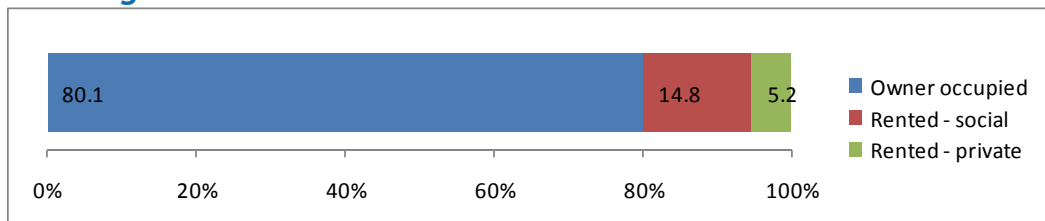

Deprivation:

The Index of Multiple Deprivation (IMD) 2010 combines 7 different elements of deprivation at neighbourhood level (or lower layer super output areas—LSOAs).

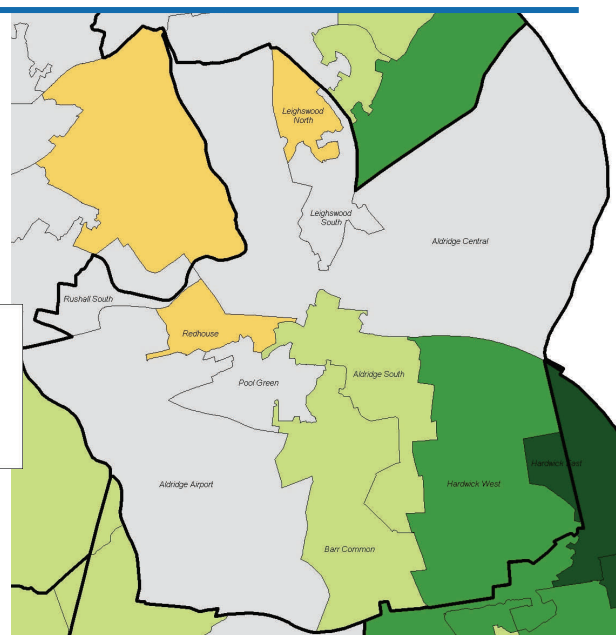
Map (right) shows variations in deprivation across the ward. The score for the ward given below is a population-weighted average of all its neighbourhoods.

Walsall is the 30th most deprived local authority district out of 326 in England. The ward is much less deprived than the borough overall, with an estimated score that makes it the 17th most deprived ward out of 20 in Walsall. However, the Redhouse and Leighswood North areas are much more deprived than the rest of the ward.
