







Geography

 than borough average of 27)








A Map of Facilities in Aldridge North & Walsall Wood Ward













Population Structure

- Similar over 65's to borough






Economic Summary

79.5% of working age people in this ward were **economically active** (2011 Census), this exceeded the Walsall value of 74% and National Value of 76.8%

The largest occupation group in the ward was Professional (14.2%) followed by Skilled Trades (13.5%)

In November 2017 there were only **140 benefit claimants** in the ward – 85 men and 50 women (see below)











Deprivation



Childhood Obesity



- The above charts show the proportion of children resident in the ward that are overweight or obese in Reception (Aged 5) and in Year 6 (Age 10).
- Of the 20 Walsall wards, Aldridge North & Walsall Wood ranks 13th in Reception and 14th in Year 6 in terms of the prevalence of excess weight in childhood.










- Well established residential area with access to Greenbelt and good quality industrial areas (e.g. Maybrook industrial Estate).
- Local centres providing a range of good services: Walsall Wood and Streets Corner.
- Recent transport improvements at Shire Oak Junction and Streets Corner.
- Key businesses located in the area include European Steelcraft Limited and DSV.
- Former Wheel Public House recent appeal supports Council's site allocation for Showpeople.
- Council investment in Oak Park Leisure Centre with proposals for further investment.
- Future proposals/opportunities include Vigo Quarry due to become open space, former Walsall Wood Library currently being marketed, recent approval for Sunnyside Farm – housing in greenbelt.
- Further disposal opportunity once the out of hours response centre (Streets Corner) is relocated.
