


- Covers 7.8 sq km (783 ha)

- Population density of 16.7 people per hectare (lower than borough average of 27.3)





Walsall Ward Map










Economic Summary



79.5% of working age people in Aldridge North & Walsall Wood ward were economically active. This was much higher than the Walsall value of 74.0% and the national value of 76.8% (2011)*.

Unemployment Claimants (aged 16-64) May 2010

•	The largest occupation group in the ward was
	Professional (14.2%) followed by Skilled Trades
	(13.5%) (2011)*.

- Of working age ward residents, 18.5% had no formal qualifications. Walsall's value was 24.3%, and 15.0% nationally (2011)*.
- In May 2019, 2.9% of working aged residents (aged 16-64) were unemployed and seeking work. This equated to 232 people and was below the Walsall average of 5.0%.



Deprivation







Childhood Obesity in Aldridge North and Walsall Wood


Key Messages:

- In Aldridge North and Walsall Wood, the rate of excess weight in Reception Children has
- increased very slightly since 2015.

 Aldridge North and Walsall Wood ranks 10th/20 wards (1st = lowest rate) for excess weight in 50 kg. Reception aged children.
- In Year 6 children, the rate of excess weight has decreased very slightly.
- In addition, Aldridge North and Walsall Wood ranks 4th/20 wards for excess weight (1st = lowest rate) for excess weight in Y6 children.















Regeneration








- Well established residential area with access to Greenbelt and good quality industrial areas (e.g. Maybrook industrial Estate).
- Local centres providing a range of good services: Walsall Wood and Streets Corner.
- Recent transport improvements at Shire Oak Junction and Streets Corner - increased capacity to meet need.
- Key businesses located in the area include European Steelcraft Limited and XPO Logistics.
- Former Wheel Public House appeal supports Council's site allocation for Showpeople.
- Council investment in Oak Park Leisure Centre construction of over-flow car park underway (Aug 2019).
- Housing proposals/opportunities include former Walsall Wood Library (sale agreed and legals progressing), Sunnyside Farm – housing in greenbelt (previously developed land), and allocated housing sites at Walsall Road.
- Further disposal opportunity once the out of hours response centre (Streets Corner) is relocated.
