


Geography






- Covers 3.83 sq km (383 ha)

- Population density of 33.8 people per hectare (higher than borough average of 27.3)







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



Economic Summary




79.2% of working age people in Bloxwich East ward were economically active. This was higher than the Walsall value of 74.0% and the national value of 76.8% (2011)*.

Unemployment Claimants (aged 16-64), May 2019

- The largest occupation group in the ward was Professional (17.2%) followed by Administrative & Secretarial (13.7%) (2011)*.
- Of working age ward residents, 14.7% had no formal qualifications. Walsall's value was 24.3%, and 15.0% nationally (2011)*.
- In May 2019, 5.9% of working aged residents (aged 16-64) were unemployed and seeking work. This equated to 442 people and was slightly above the Walsall average of 5.0%.




Deprivation







Childhood Obesity in Bloxwich East

Key Messages:

- In Bloxwich East, the rate of excess weight in Reception Children has slightly decreased between 2015 – 2018.
- However, Bloxwich East ranks 20th/20 wards (1st = lowest rate) for excess weight in Reception aged children
- . In Year 6 children, the rate of excess weight continues to increase.
- Blakenall ranks 17th/20 wards for excess weight (1st = lowest rate) for excess weight in Y6 children.









Bloxwich East ward has **higher** adult obesity prevalence (16.9%) compared to the borough (14.4%).





Provision of unpaid care in Bloxwich East is similar to the borough average (11.6% and 11.4% respectively).





Crime by type highlights 'violence without injury' as the most prolific type in this ward during 2018.





Voluntary & Community Organisations



- Stan Ball Centre run by Bloxwich Community Partnership & caters mainly for elderly borough residents. Provides subsidised trips, entertainment shows, events, day care provision & has a bistro.
- Green Rivers Association very small group that offers youth provision & social groups.
- St John's Methodist Church and Centre Victoria Road used extensively by the community and has linked up with Blakenall Children's Centre and the North Locality panels to deliver projects for our more vulnerable families.

- £1m Bloxwich **Townscape Heritage Initiative** (2006)
- Bloxwich Gardens and Fountain Restoration.
- Part of the former New Deal area 10year government initiative which promoted neighbourhood regeneration.





Community facilities include Stan Ball Centre, Green Rivers, and Blakenall Village Centre

Canalside House – providing mental health and early intervention services by Dudley & Walsall Mental Health Partnership NHS Trust.



Residential developments, including Care UK intensive support accommodation, Bromford supported living units, and whg affordable schemes at Grovenor House, Barracks Lane and Well Place. Plus Par Court and Fountain Court

Employability Hub, Walsall Academy campus provides vocational training facility for Sixth Form students from 2018/19.




A34 North Red Route and Bloxwich Bus Showcase
