


### Geography






- Covers 4.62 sq km (462 ha)

- Population density of 28.7 people per hectare (higher than borough average of 27.3)







#### Walsall Ward Map





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



#### **Economic Summary**



75.8% of working age people in Paddock ward were economically active. This
compared with the Walsall value of 74.0% and the National Value of 76.8%

(2011)\*.

The largest occupation group in the ward was Professional (24.6%) followed by Managers & Senior Officials (14.3%) (2011)\*.

- Of working age ward residents, only 14.2% had no formal qualifications. Walsall's value was 24.3%, and 15.0% nationally (2011)\*.
- In May 2019, 2.5% of working aged residents (aged 16-64) were unemployed and seeking work. This equated to 198 people and was below the Walsall average of 5.0%.


Unemployment Claimants (aged 16-64) May 2019







#### Childhood Obesity in Paddock

#### Key Messages:

- In Paddock, the rate of excess weight in Reception Children has decreased.
- In addition, Paddock ranks 1st/20 wards (1st = lowest rate) for excess weight in Reception aged children
- . In Year 6 children, the rate of excess weight continues to increase.
- Paddock ranks 5th/20 wards for excess weight (1st = lowest rate) for excess weight in Y6 children.









Crime by type highlights 'residential burglary' as the most prolific in this ward during 2018, closely followed by 'violence without injury'.





## **Voluntary & Community Organisations**



- Park Hall Community Association located at Broadway North Centre (used to house ASC staff) - this facility has closed & CA looking for new location to operate with support from Walsall Council.
- Park Hall Residents' Association chaired by Cllr R Martin currently involved in consultation of GP merger.
- Park Hall Neighbourhood Watch chaired by Robert Read 1,000s members. Produces quarterly newsletter – 'Watchword'.
- The Grange Players Grange Playhouse recently closed for refurbishment.
   Group planning fundraiser to help with essential maintenance required.
- Park Hall Whatsapp Group originally set up to share information & suspicious behaviour. Started with several streets in Park Hall being involved, now numbers have increased throughout Park Hall & the creation of sub-groups across Paddock ward. Careful managing of groups required due to bordering vigilante behaviour & potential for racial / religious prejudice

#### Regeneration








- Easy access to facilities in Walsall Town Centre.
- Includes considerable Greenspace including Walsall Arboretum and Merrions Wood. £250k investment in new Arboretum Water Park facility in 2013.
- Home to several SMEs and Chamberlin and Hill Castings Group HQ - a prominent manufacturer of Automotive Castings. WBA FC's training ground is located off Birmingham Road and has been subject of major investment.
- Residential development potential with land allocated for housing: Woodside Close and Cricket Close Allotment and Tennis Court.
- Transport improvements A34 Sprint (bus rapid transit scheme) TfWM led works linked to HS2 connectivity programme, and further local safety schemes to build upon existing road safety improvements along the route such as average speed cameras.
- Broadway North Council owned asset currently occupied by Park Hall Community Association, former Adult Social Care operational property – sales process commencing August 2019 (Asset of Community Value).
