


Unemployment & Benefits








Deprivation

- Significant pockets of relative deprivation do exist – New Invention Central; Lodge Farm North; Little London South & King's Hill.







Deprivation - Health

- The most deprived pockets of neighbourhoods consist of Lodge Farm North; Routh Hay West; King's Hill & Bentley North.








Road Traffic Noise – 16 hour average








Recorded Crime








Deprivation – Barriers to Housing & Services

- Some pockets of more deprived LSOAs do exist within Willenhall South but no lower than decile 3.








Childhood Obesity










