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Welcome to Bloxwich East



Did you know?

- **History** - Bloxwich Town centre is mostly Victorian and Edwardian building with leafy greenspaces and parks. From the Georgian period through to the 1960's, Bloxwich had more public houses than any other area of Walsall.
- **Landmarks** - Queen Victoria's Fountain, unveiled in 1891, was the first public fountain in Bloxwich. Glacial anvil stones were positioned in early 1900's as a monument to the 'bitties and tackies' of Bloxwich who constructed needles and awl blades for the leather industry.
- On 23 November 1981 Bloxwich was struck by an F1/T2 tornado as part of the National record-breaking tornado outbreak in the UK.
- **Famous Residents** – Pat Collins Showman, fairground and cinema mogul, former Liberal MP (1922) and Mayor of Walsall (1938). Long associated with Bloxwich since his attendance at the Bloxwich Wake in 1882, he rapidly transformed the travelling fairs. After the council abolished the wakes, deeming them a “nightmare of drunkenness and lawlessness”, Pat held the Collins Grand fete and Gala by way of preserving the Bloxwich Wakes enjoyed by local colliers. Pat died at his home, Lime Tree House, on what is now ASDA Car Park and was buried in Bloxwich Cemetery (1943). A memorial Clock was erected in King George V playing fields in 1955, and then re-erected in 1991, sited in Bloxwich promenade gardens overlooking the area where he attended his first wake.
- **Tom Major-Ball** – Music hall and circus performer was born in Bloxwich 1879 and is father to Sir John Major – Former British Prime minister.

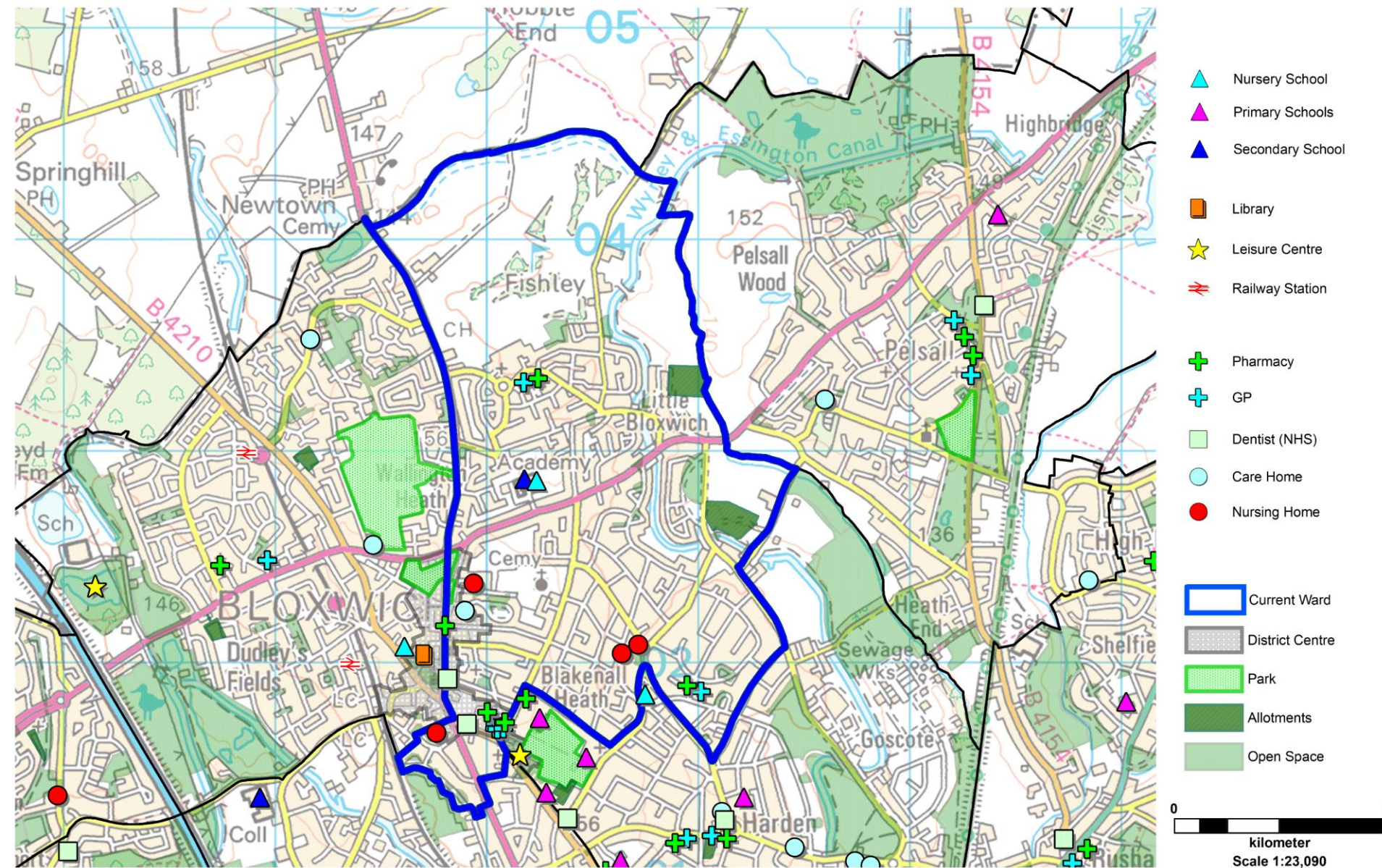

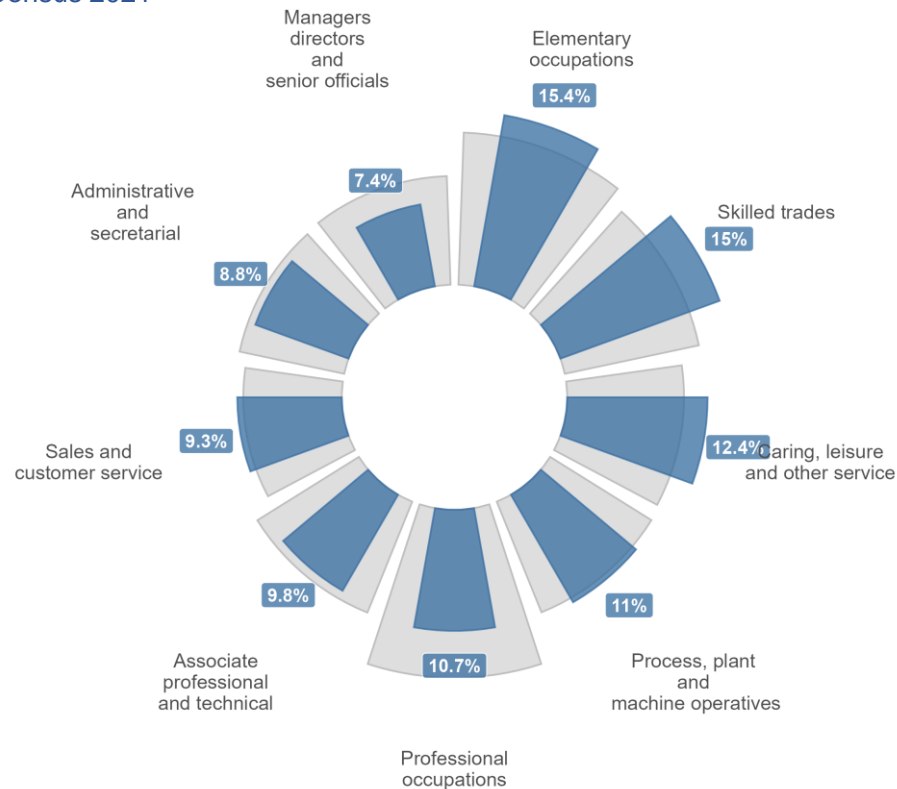

- Bloxwich East's occupational profile features higher employment in Elementary Occupations (manual, unskilled labour – 15.4% of the workforce) and skilled trades (15%). Where Bloxwich East differs greatly from the Borough picture is with fewer professional occupations: only 10.7% of the workforce (Walsall, 14.9%).
- This indicates the labour force of Bloxwich East is distributed more towards manual and trade occupations, with relatively fewer professionals than elsewhere in Walsall.

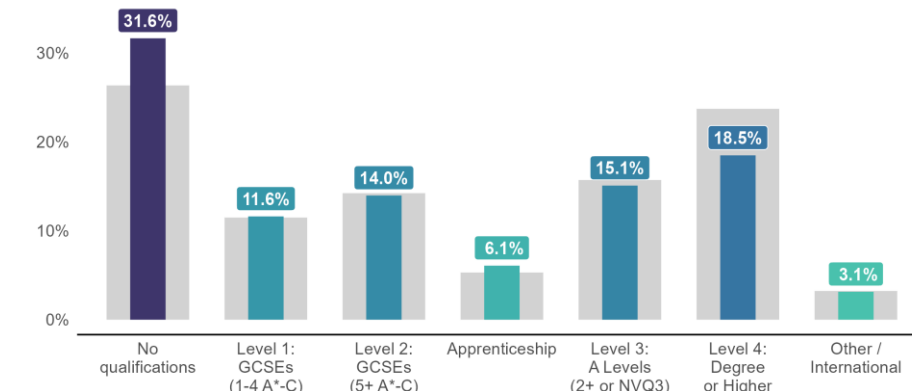

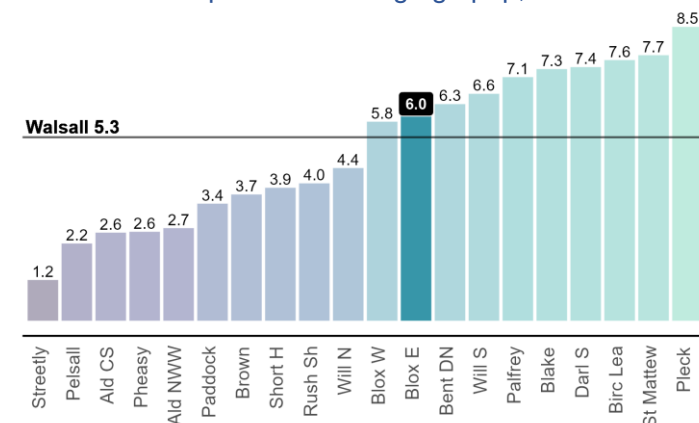

- Almost 1 in 3 (31.6%) Bloxwich East adults have no formal qualifications: higher than the Walsall borough (26.3%, approx. 1 in 4), and fewer have a degree or higher. The proportion of those with GCSEs, apprenticeships or A Levels closely matches the borough picture.

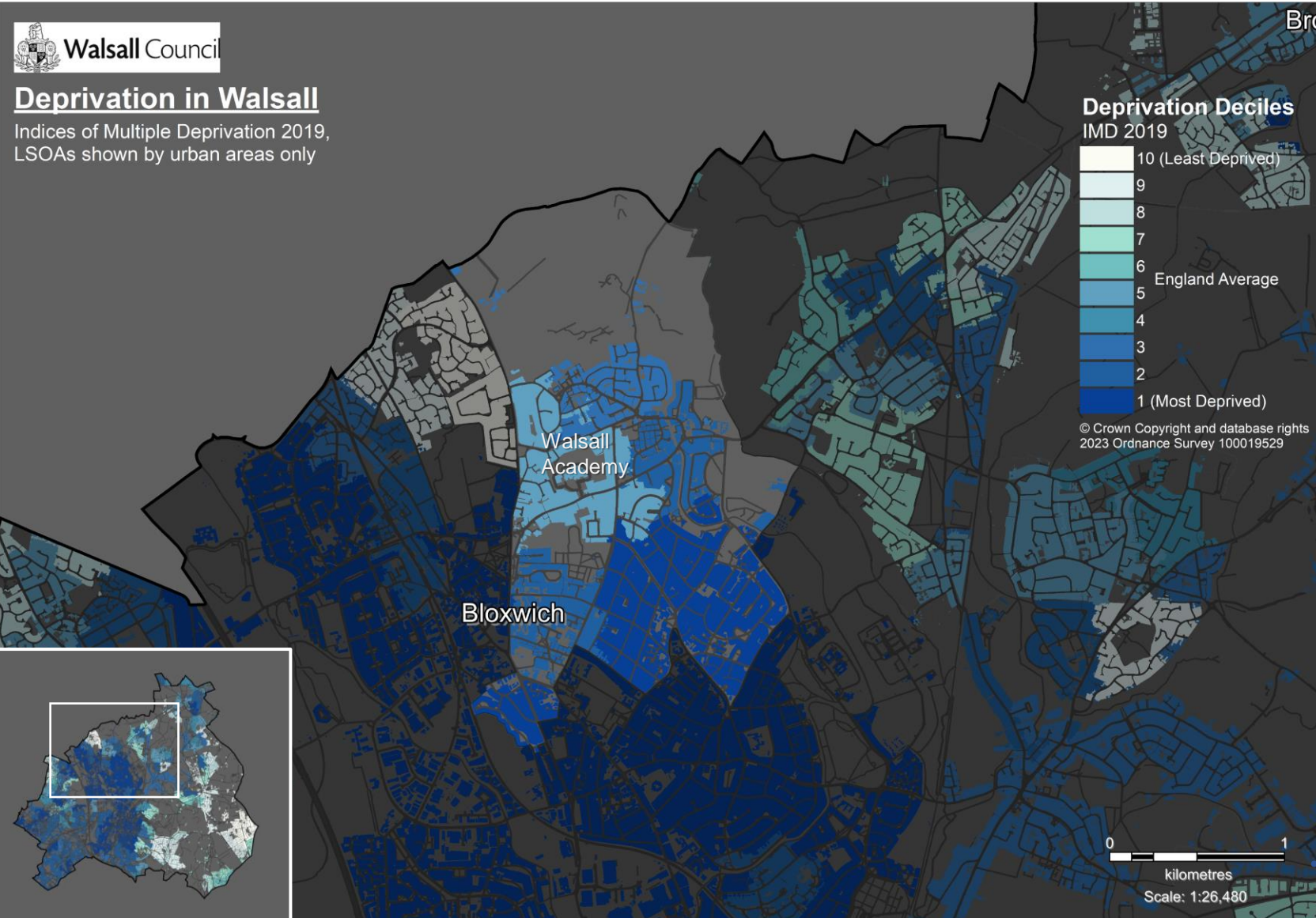

The majority of Bloxwich East's population reside in deprived areas: falling within the 20% most deprived areas in England.

It faces particular deprivation challenges with:

- **Adult Skills** (decile 2)
- **Education, Skills and Training** (decile 2)
- **Children and Young People** (decile 3)
- **Employment** (decile 3)
- **Health** (decile 3)

However, Bloxwich East ranks positively for **proximity to services**, falling within the 6th Decile of England areas.

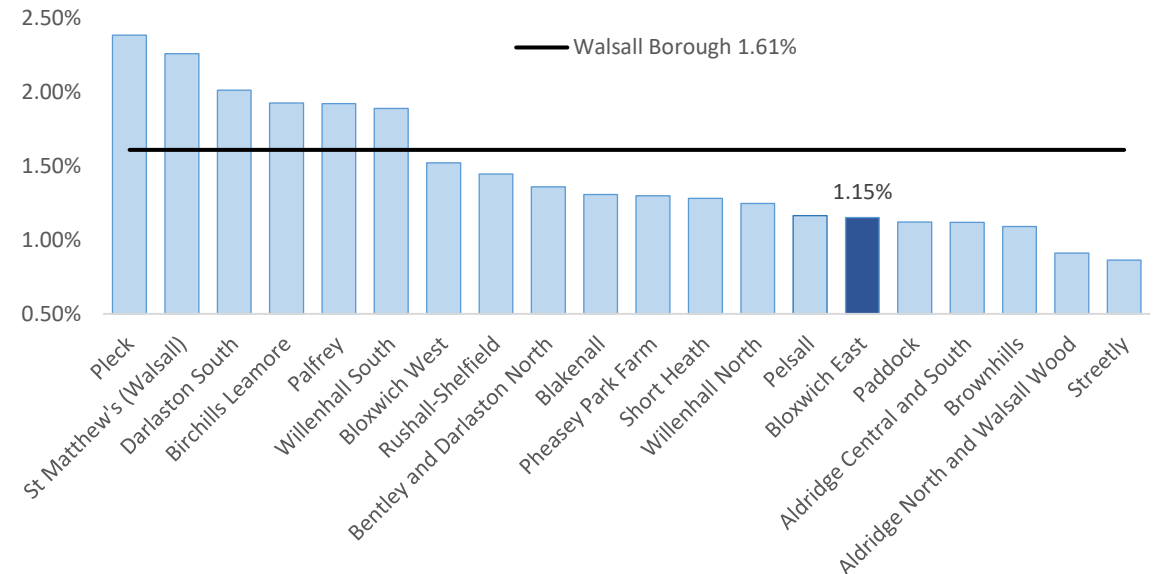

- Bloxwich East household population of full-time students and school children, aged over 5yrs, is 21.2%, close to the Walsall figure of 22.1% and very similar to Paddock(21.5%).
- More Single-family households consisting of a lone parent with dependent children making up 10.6% of households, similar to Pleck and higher than Walsall (8.9%). The number of lone parent households in Bloxwich East is double that of Pelsall (279).
- Lower number of homeowners - **51% owned**. Of those, 55% are owned outright, without a mortgage or shared ownership. 13% of households rent privately or live rent free. 1 in 3 homes in Bloxwich East are socially rented, compared 1 in 6 in Short Heath. At 35.8%, this ranks **4th highest** in Walsall (23.7%) and twice as many in number as in Willenhall North.
- The number of households living with **no** central heating across the borough has positively decreased by about half since 2011. Bloxwich east has 6th least number of households living with no central heating at 1.15%. This is significantly better compared to 2.39% in Pleck and the Walsall Borough figure of 1.61%.

Development / Regeneration

- **Bloxwich East Ward** – the area is predominantly residential, with areas of Green Belt to the north and Bloxwich town centre to the west of the ward with a focus on retail and town centre related uses.
- **Bloxwich District Centre** - with national retailers/ occupiers including Asda, Home Bargains, JD Wetherspoon and multiple independent retailers and other town centre related businesses.
- Community Facilities include Stan Ball Centre, Green Rivers and Blakenall Village Centre.
- The local community plays an **active role** in Bloxwich, and the Council has a **good relationship** with groups having delivered several programmes and initiatives in the area including public realm/environmental enhancements to improve the viability and vibrancy of the centre.
- **Residential developments**, including Care UK intensive support accommodation, Bromford supported living units, and WHG affordable schemes at Grovenor House, Barracks Lane and Well Place.
- **A34 North Red Route** and **Bloxwich Bus Showcase**.
- **Bloxwich Town Deal** to deliver significant investment over the coming years and benefits to Bloxwich East Ward.
- Town Deal projects include the **Construction Skills Through Regeneration, Bloxwich Active Travel & Connectivity** project, which includes canal towpath improvements between Walsall and Bloxwich and the **Incubation Space & Digital Access**.
- Council works to provide continued support to businesses/landowners regarding their development requirements and growth aspirations.

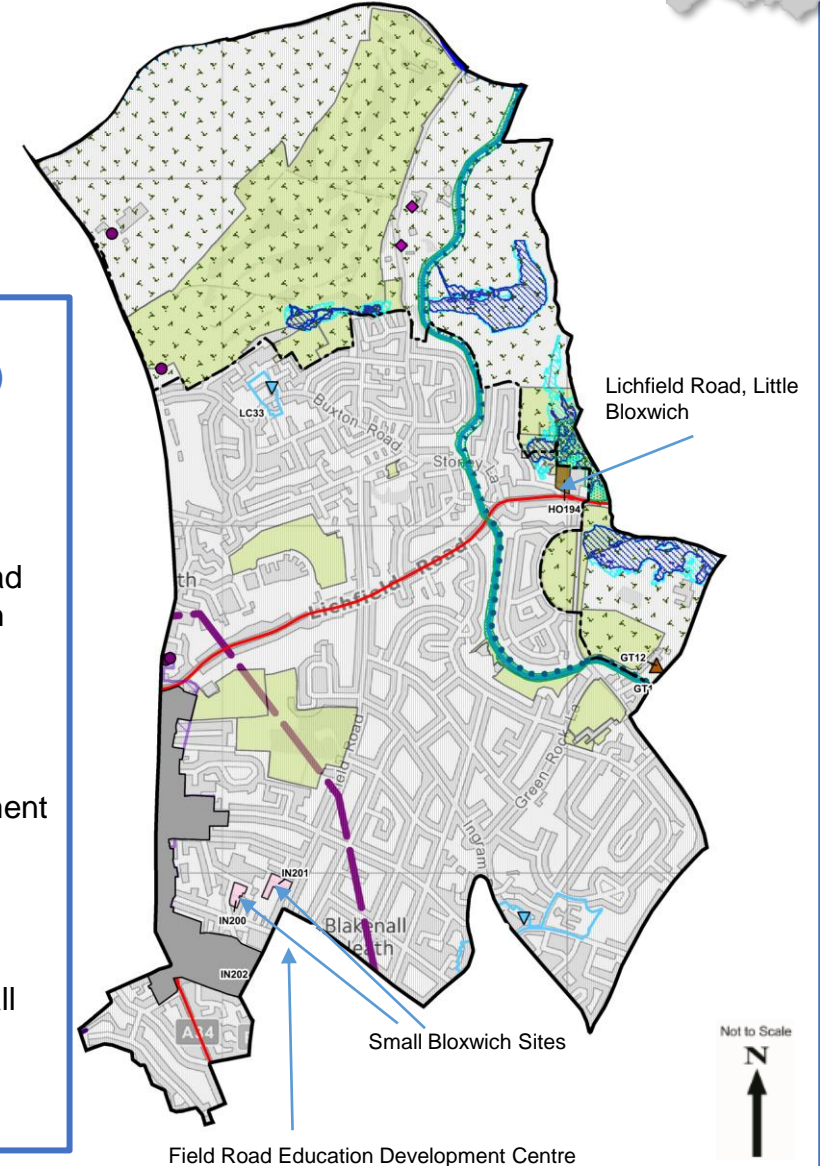

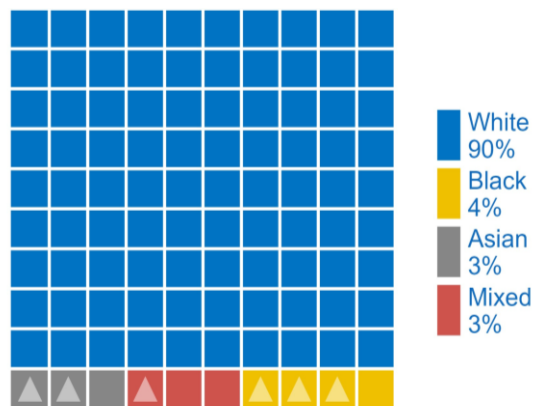

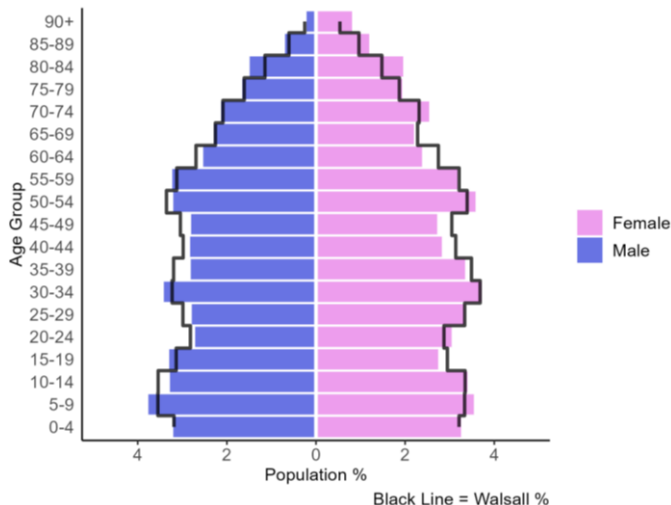

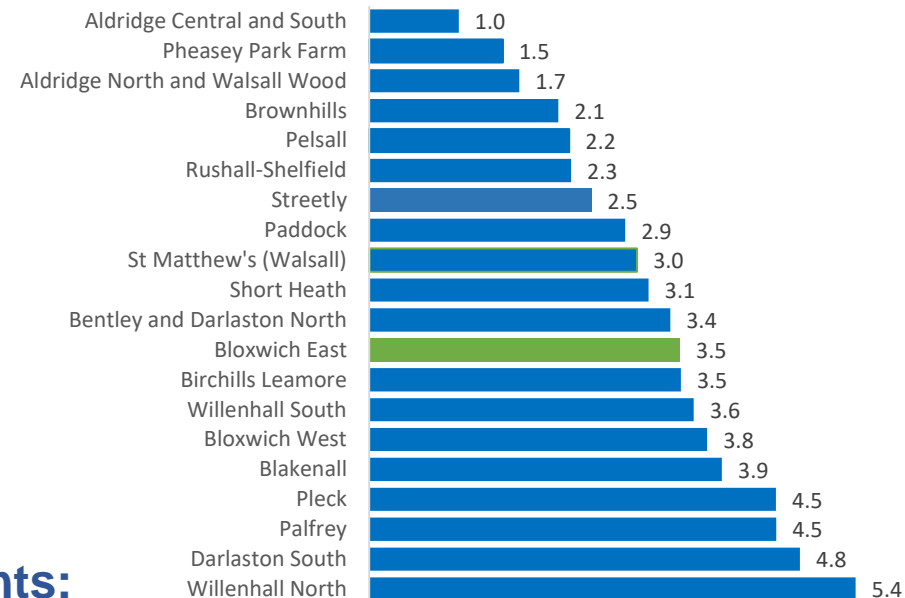
Population Pyramid

Key Points:

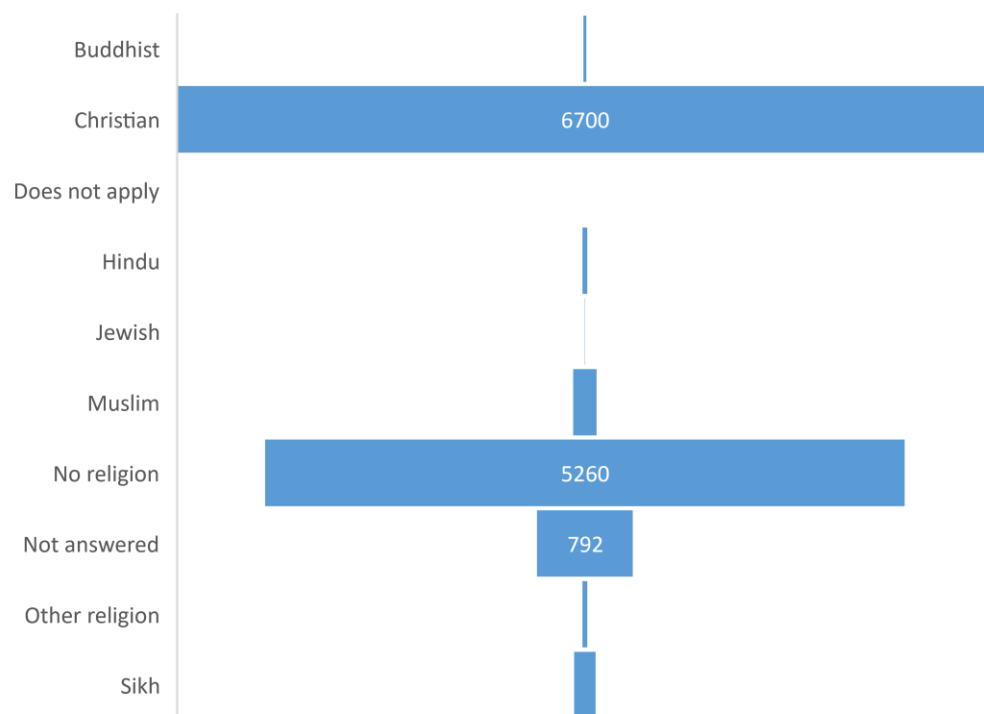
- Bloxwich East has one of the younger populations of Walsall's wards, with around 2 in 9 people under 16yrs, and a median age of 38 years old, close to the Borough average (39 years). A contrast to the oldest ward Aldridge Central & South at 48 years
- In terms of Population Density, Bloxwich East is the 9th most populated ward, increasing by 9% in the last decade. This is 3,469 people per sq. km. For context: Walsall's density is 2,733, and Aldridge North & Walsall Wood, has roughly half as many people per sq. km (1,676).
- Ethnically, the ward is predominantly White British (90%) with smaller populations of Asian (3%), Black (4%), Mixed (3%) These populations have all increased since 2011, with the Black group quadrupling in percentage.

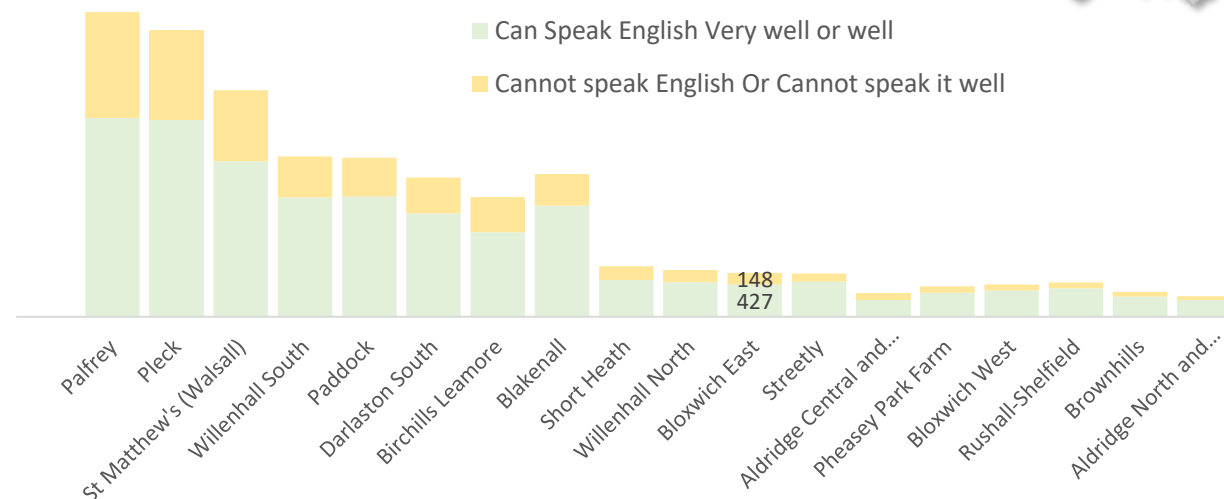

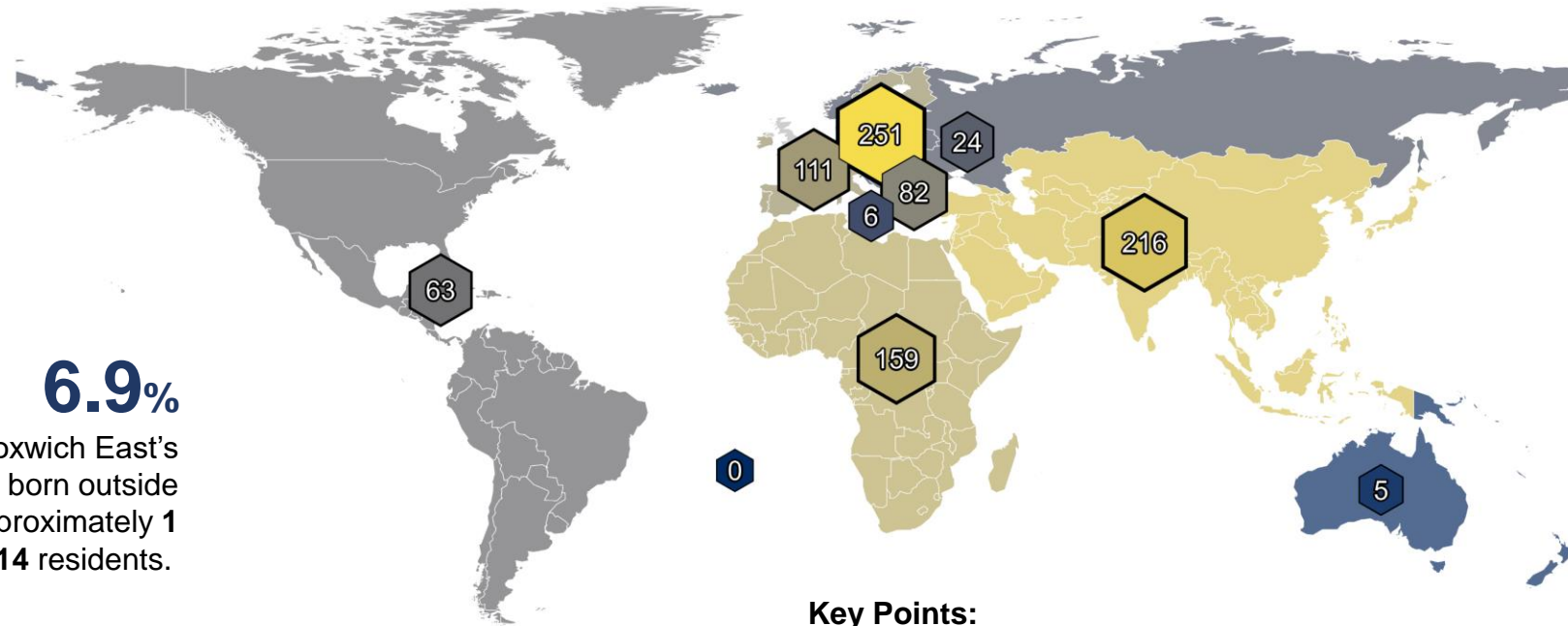


- 95.5% of households have all **or** at least one adult where English is the main language, compared to 81.1% in Palfrey and Pleck. Where English is not the main spoken language, 26% of these residents cannot speak English or cannot speak it well.
- Bloxwich East has a lower number of Households where no residents speak English as main language (145) 2.7% compared to 14.2% Pleck (788) & St. Matthew's 11.1% (806).

46% Household residents are Not identified as Religious (Borough 35%)

- Bloxwich East ward has approximately half (50.7%) residents of Christian religion. This is higher the Walsall borough percentage of 45%. It also has a higher proportion of residents with no identified religion.
- 39.8% of Bloxwich East residents reported in 2021 Census as having No Religion, much higher compared to Palfrey ward with just 11.1%.

Global Map of Non-UK Born Aldridge Central & South Residents by Area of Birth

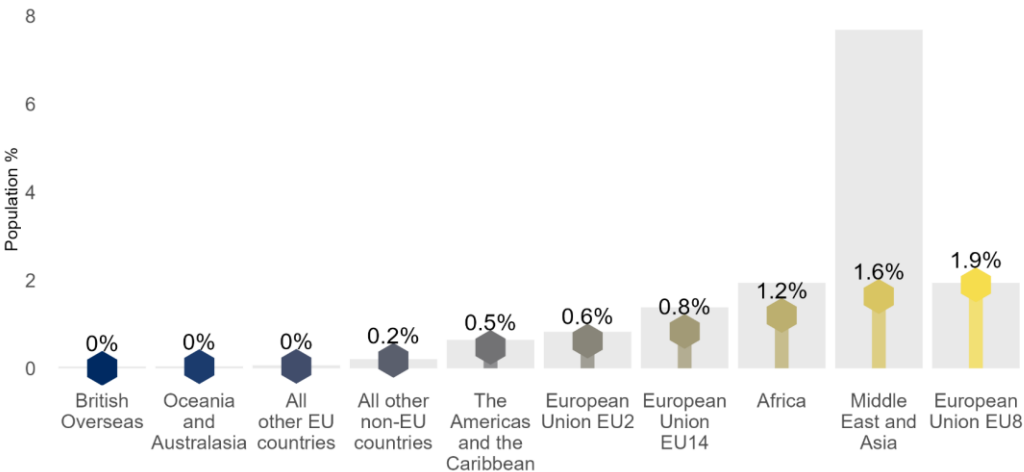

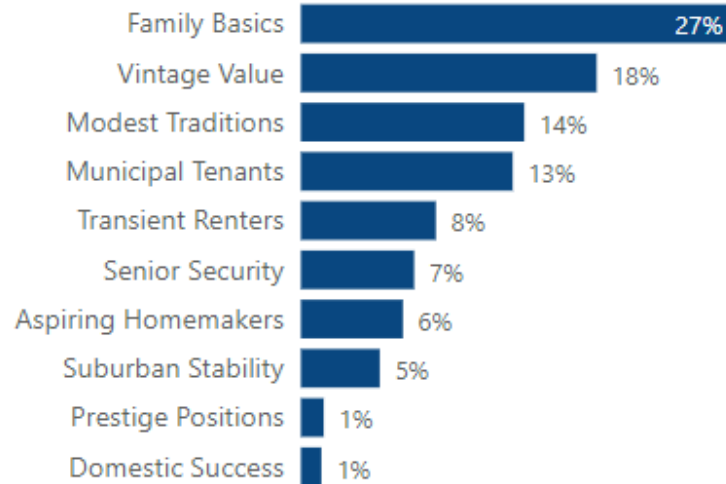
Key Points:

- With 93.1% of residents being UK born, Bloxwich East has the 6th largest proportion of UK born residents of the 20 Walsall wards.
- When contrasted with the borough's 14.7% of the population being born outside of the UK, Bloxwich East's is approximately half at 6.9%.
- Whilst few, comprising 1.9% of the population, EU8 born residents are the largest non-UK countries of origin (2004 EU enlargement nations such as Poland, Hungary, Lithuania, Slovenia and Slovakia). It is suggestive of newly emergent communities. This differs from the wider borough, where the largest non-UK area of birth is most often the Middle East and Asia: in Bloxwich East it is 2nd, at 1.6%, contrasted to approximately 8% of the population across Walsall.
- EU8 aside, Bloxwich East has a smaller proportion of non-UK born residents from each area of birth, relative to the wider borough.

Social Segmentation

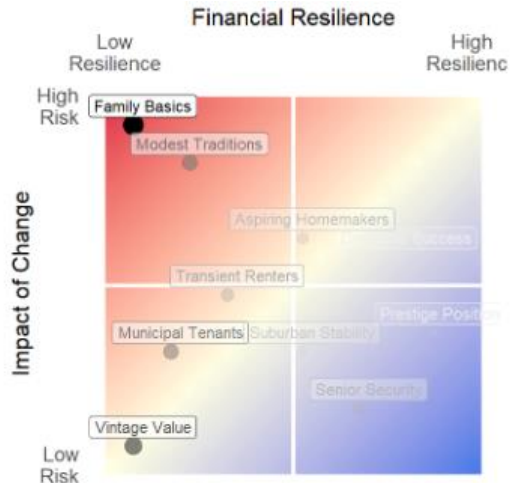


Social Segment Composition of Walsall Wards (% Households)



Key Points:

- Social Segmentation is a means of categorising residential populations by shared socio-economic traits and similar behaviours.
- Bloxwich East features a wide range of segments, with the largest three being Family Basics, Vintage Value and Modest Traditions.
- Family Basics accounts for over a quarter of households: low earning families with limited education, multiple children, poorer quality housing, and little disposable income. It is a segment highly vulnerable to economic shock/crises i.e. fuel/energy, high inflation.
- As the 2nd largest segment, Vintage Value (18% of households) are pensioners with very low disposable incomes who are more likely to experience fuel poverty and more likely to live alone.

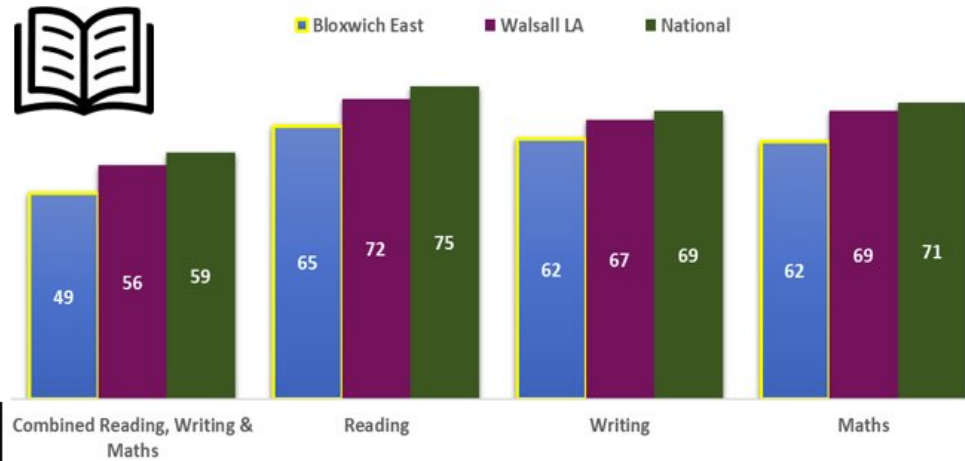

Key Points:

Attainment data by ward is matched based on children resident in the ward who attended any Walsall school within the local authority. Any children who attended an out of borough school are excluded from the analysis.

Pupils take national curriculum assessments in year 6 at the end of KS2, when most will reach the age of 11. Pupils take tests commonly referred to as SATs.

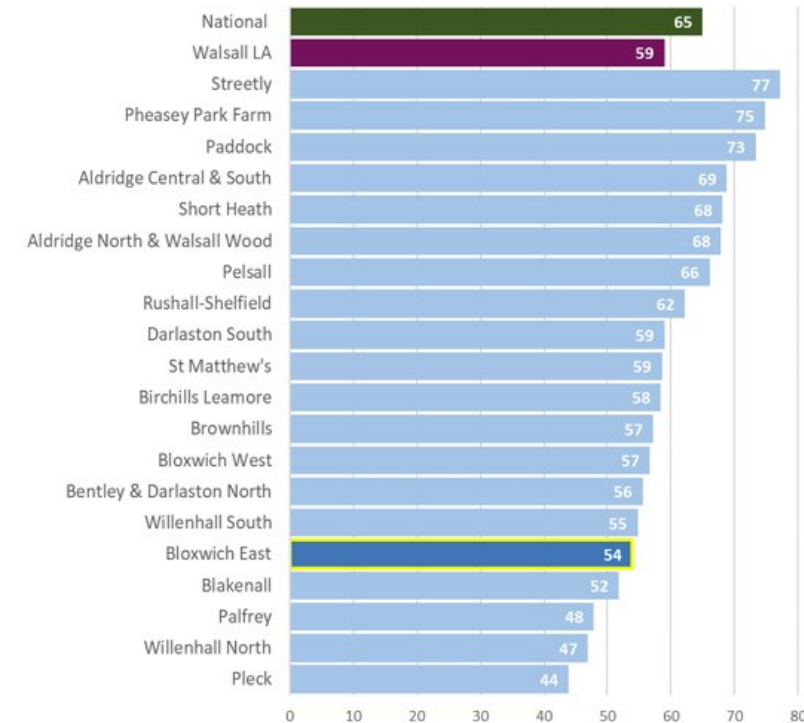
A lower proportion of children in the **Bloxwich East** ward achieved the expected standard compared to the Walsall and national figures across all subjects.

At the end of KS4 (Year 11) pupils sit examinations in a range of GCSE and other vocational qualifications.

The percentage of pupils in Walsall who have achieved at least a grade 4 or above in English and maths GCSE is slightly below national at 63%. 43% of students resident in the **Bloxwich East** ward achieved a standard pass which is below the LA average.

A significant number of students who live in the ward did not achieve a good pass in English and maths GCSE. 23% of students achieved a good pass which is 21% below the Walsall LA figure and 24% lower than the National average.

% Children who reached a good level of development in 2022

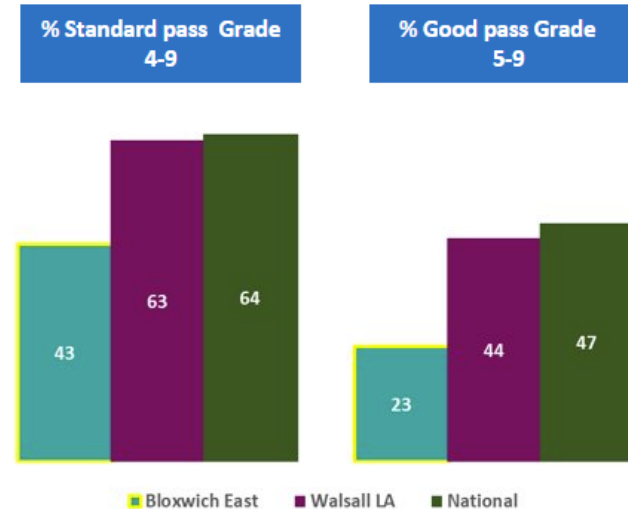


Children are defined as having reached a good level of development at the end of their Reception year if they have achieved at least the expected level in prime and specific areas of learning.

The overall GLD for Walsall in 2022 was 59%. In comparison, 54% of children who reside in the **Bloxwich East** ward achieved this threshold. This is 5% below the LA average and 11% below the national average. **Bloxwich East** ward is ranked 5th lowest compared to other wards in Walsall.



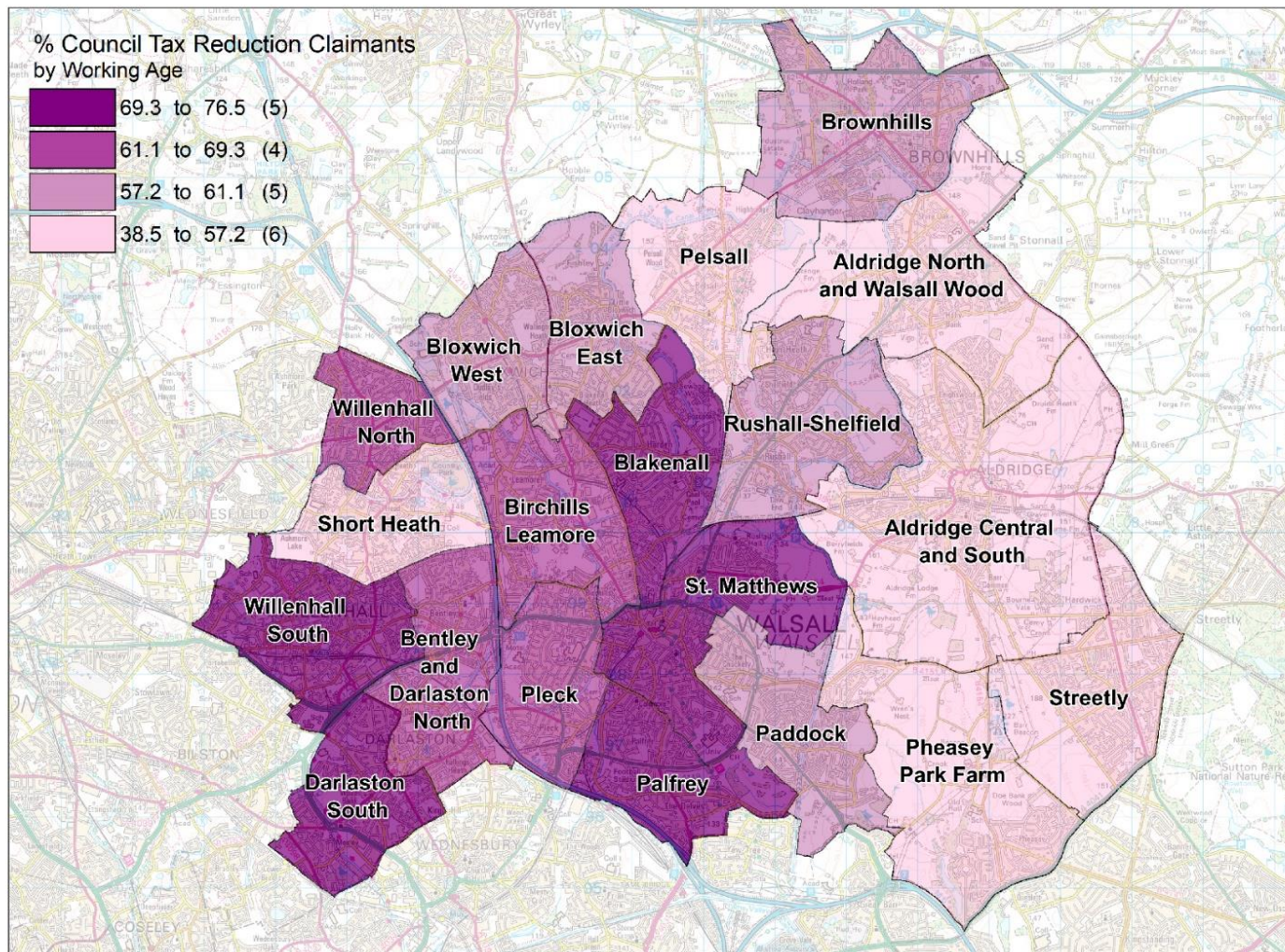
Achieving GCSE English and maths in 2022

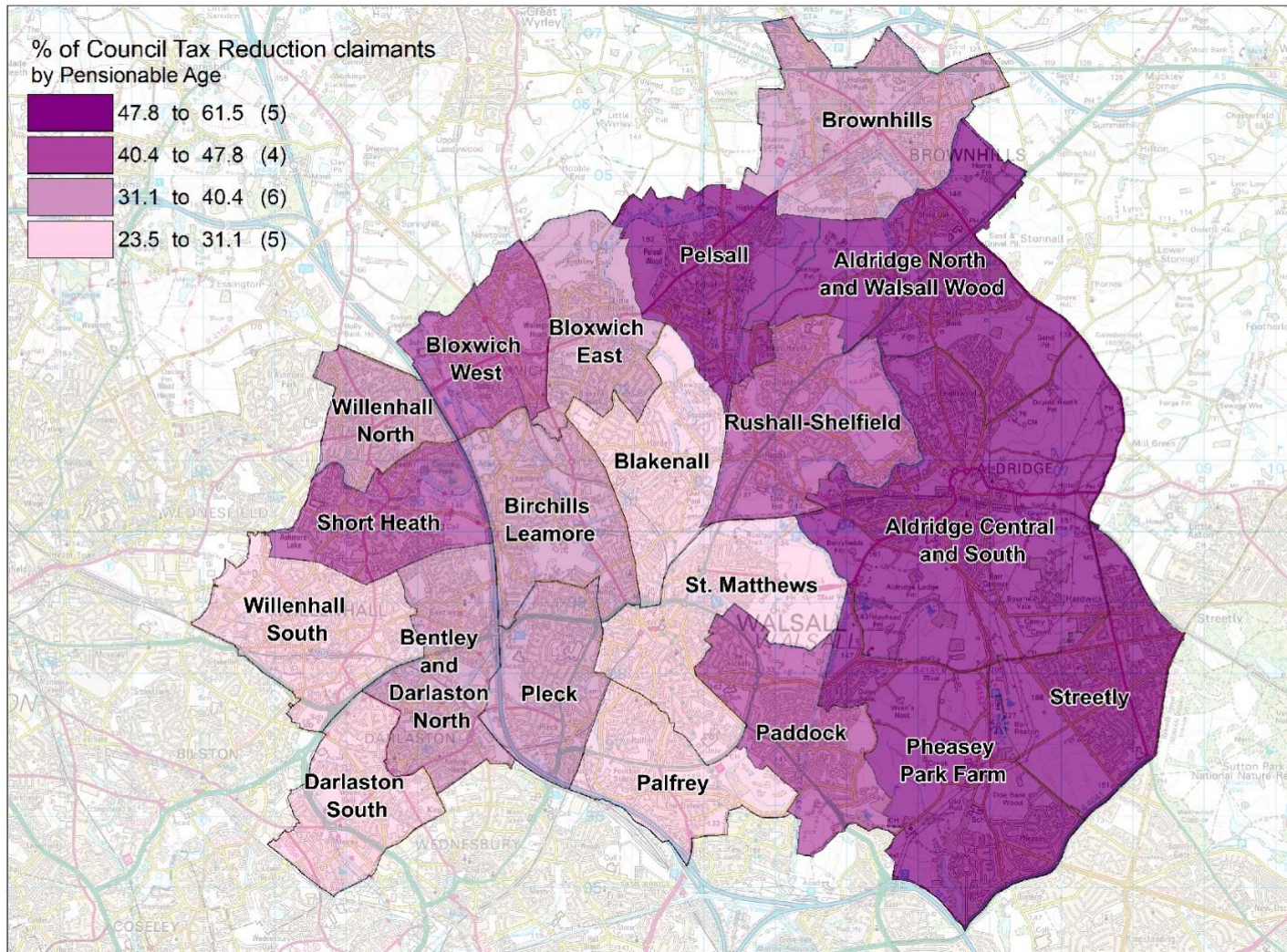

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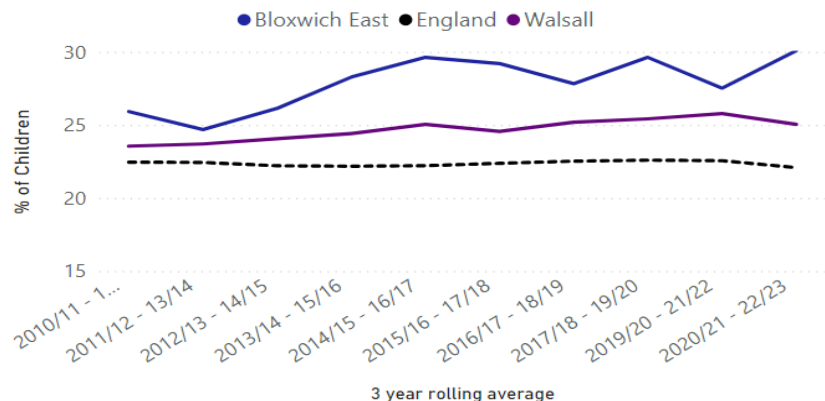

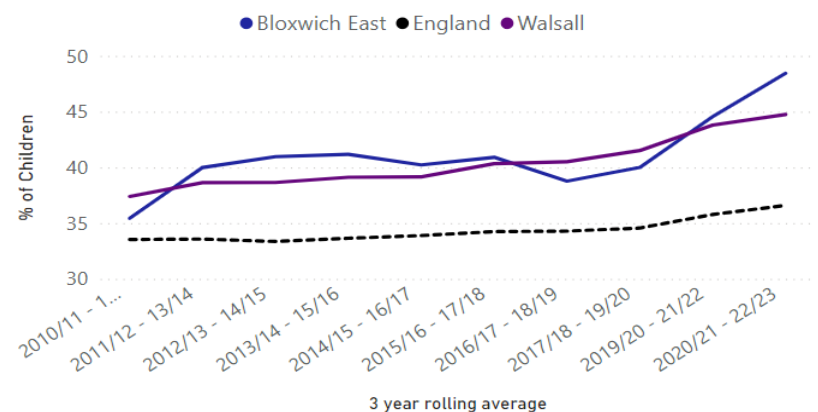


Prevalence of Overweight and Obesity in Reception Year



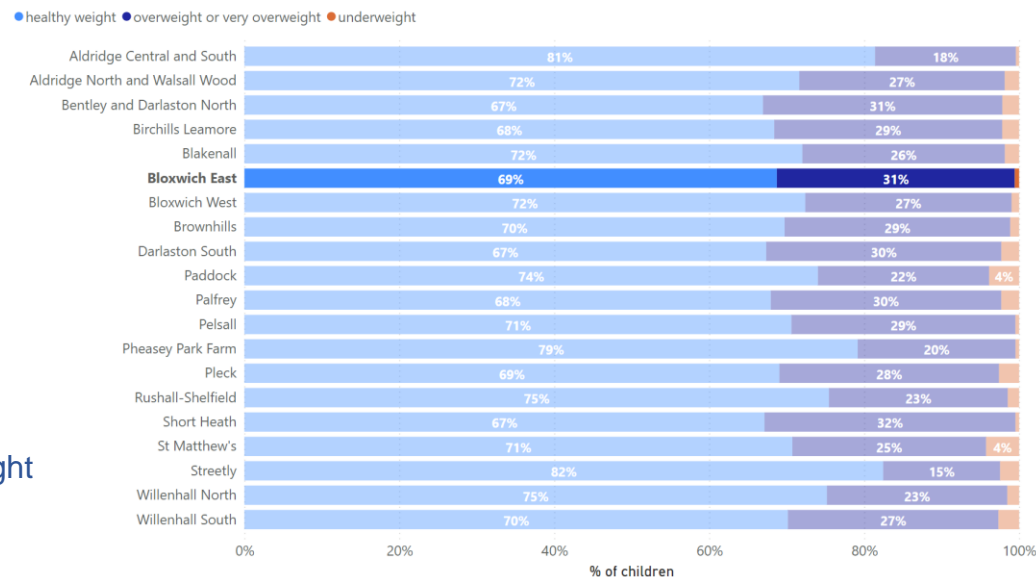

Prevalence of Overweight and Obesity in Year 6



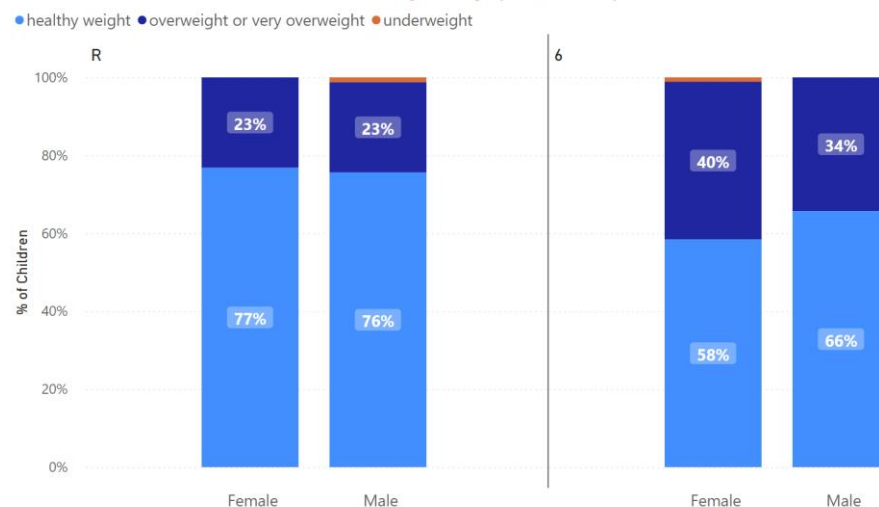

What is the General Health of Bloxwich East?

Census 2021, % of resident population



- Bloxwich East residents report their general level of health as **poorest in borough**, with 8.5% being rated Bad or Worse, ranking last of all Walsall's wards. Only 74% rate their general health Good or Better, this is lower than the England average of 82.1%.
- Approximately 1 in 12 residents in Bloxwich East reported living in poor health or worse compared to approximately 1 in 27 in Streetly ward.

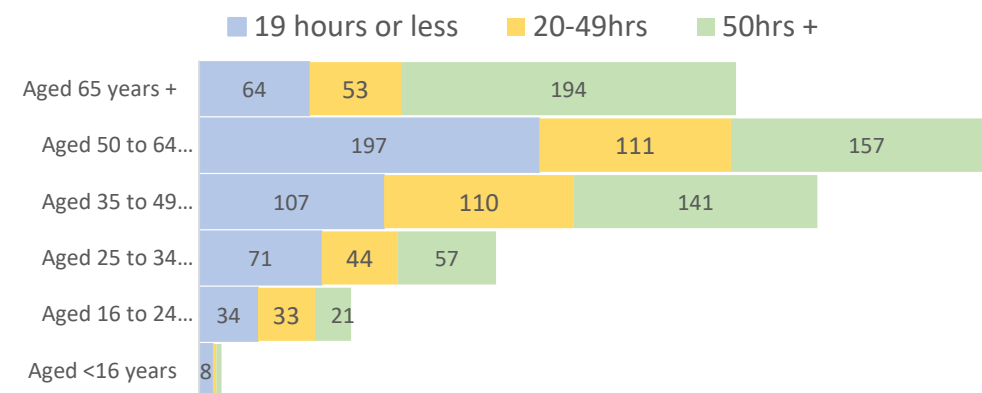

- This is above the Walsall figure (19.1%) and ranks **highest** out of Walsall's 20 wards.
- 5.4% have a long term physical or mental Health condition but daily activities are not limited, this is similar to that of Walsall overall (5.5%)

- 6th Highest** number of unpaid carers in Walsall, 1,407 compared to Pheasey with fewest (1,044) and Aldridge Central & South with most (1,471)
- 11.4%** of residents provide weekly unpaid care. Almost two thirds of carers aged over 65yrs themselves are providing more than 50hrs care per week

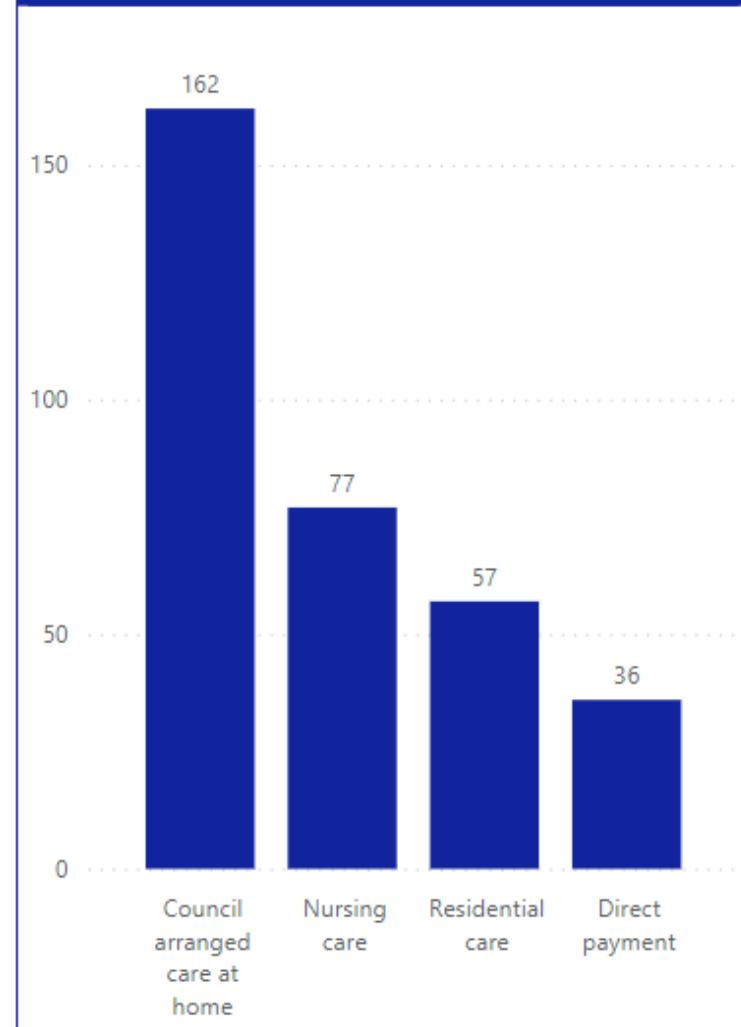

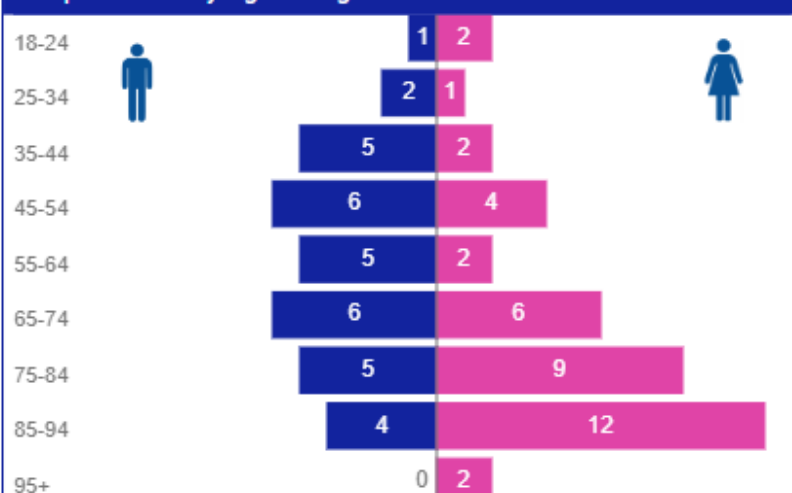

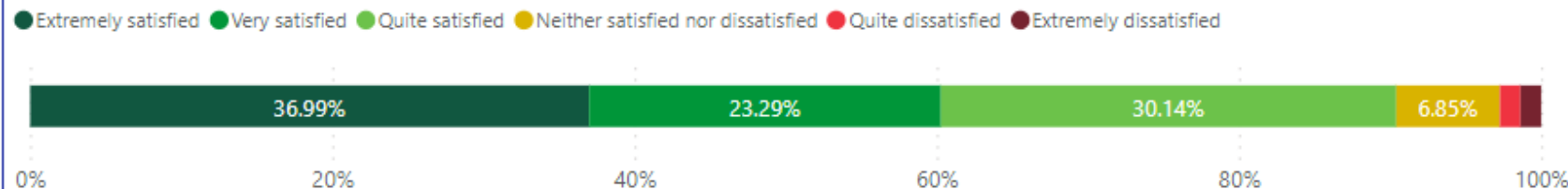

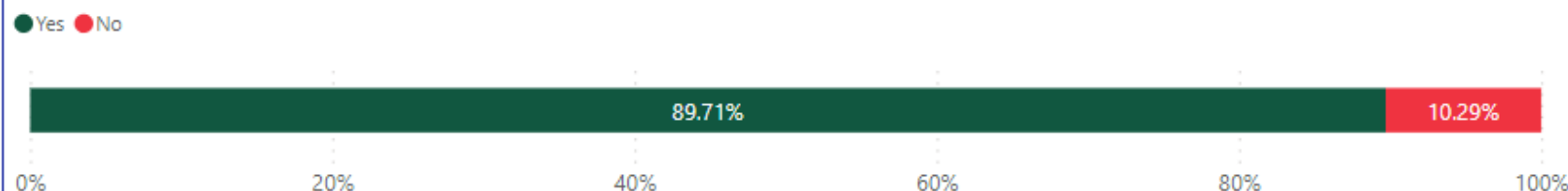

How satisfied or dissatisfied are you with the care and support services you receive?



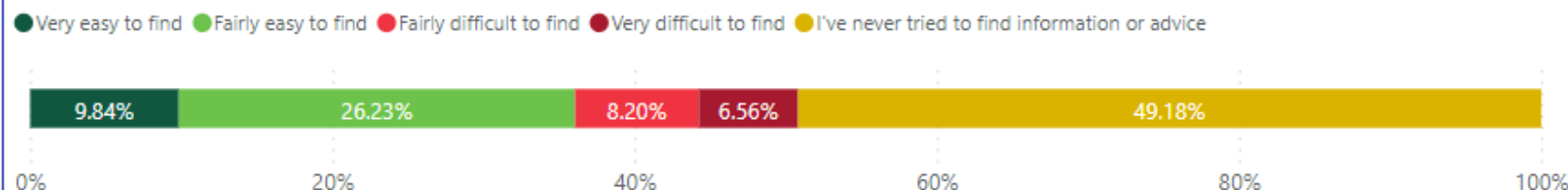
Do care and support services help you to have a better quality of life?

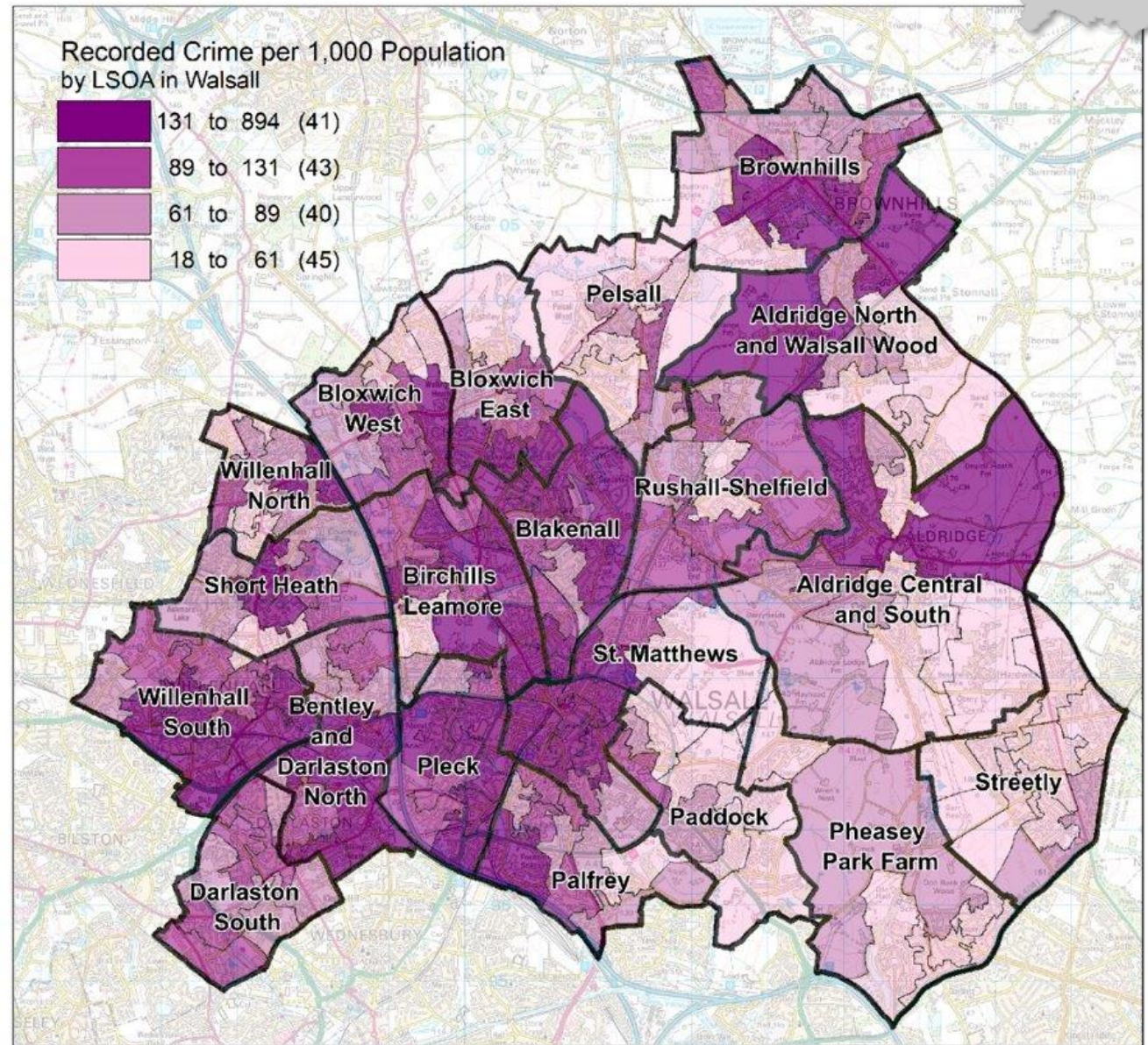

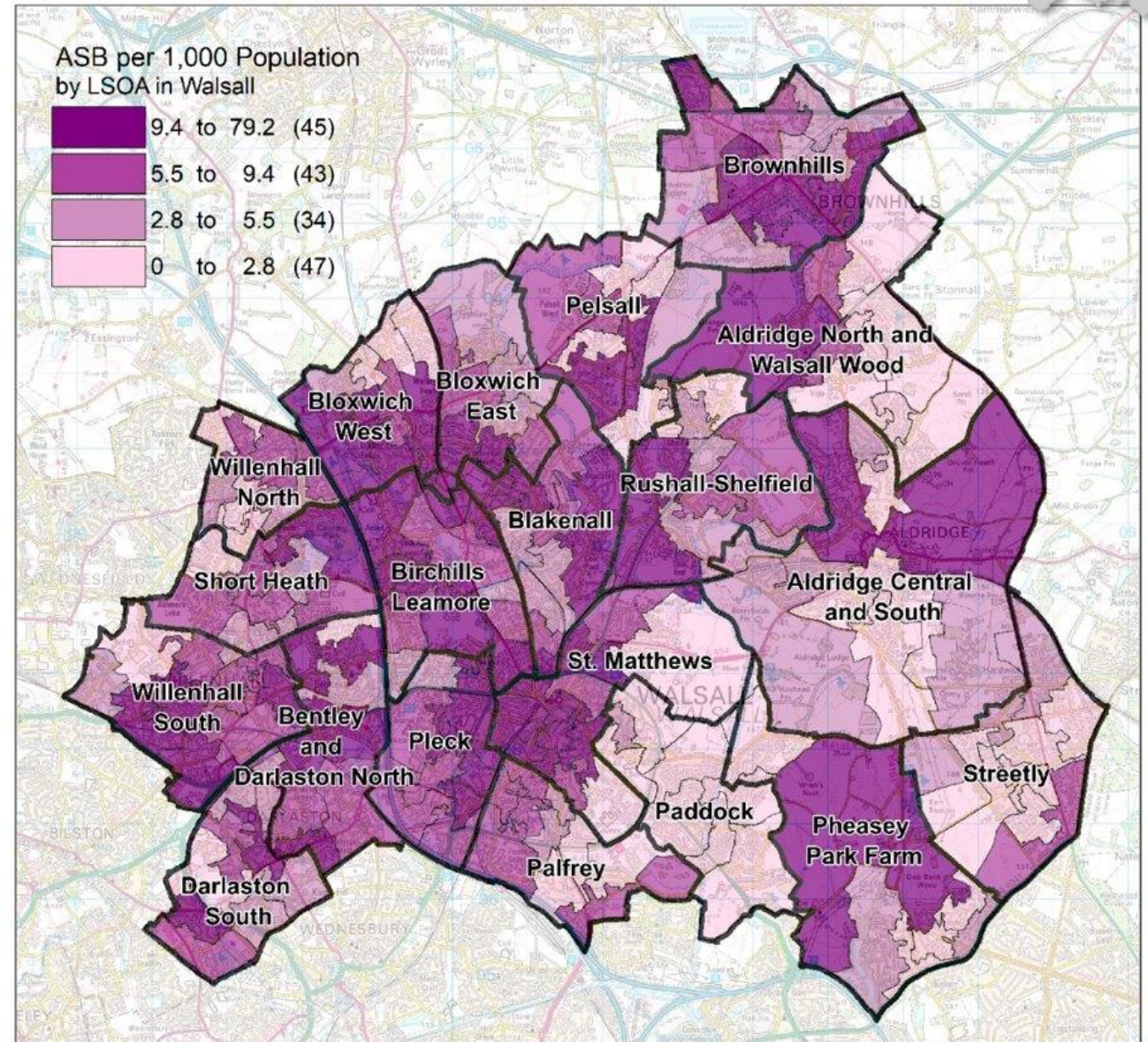
