Did you know?

- History Barr Beacon is a hill where historically fires were lit in times of attack or on celebratory occasions. It is now the site of the Barr Beacon War Memorial. As an important conservation area, 60 acres of land are designated as a local nature reserve.
- Arts Pheasey estate features one of the Walsall Silver Thread Tapestries, a set of 11 artworks produced locally in 2016 with the involvement of the communities of Walsall.
- Landmark Barr Beacon Hill is one of the highest points in Walsall with panoramic views as far as Powys in Wales. Following its latitude eastwards, it is the highest point until the Ural mountains in Russia.



- Covers 7.6 sq km (765.8 ha)
- Makes up 7.4% of the total area of Walsall Borough
- Has a population density of 1,493
 people per square kilometer
 (This is *lower* than borough average of 3.159)









Pheasey's population generally has higher qualifications than Walsall as a whole: 1 in 4 people have a degree or higher qualification and approximately 1 in 5, 21.2%, have no qualification (Walsall 26.3%, approx. 1 in 4).

- Pheasev's Claimant Count (Jobseekers Allowance) is very low, at 2.6 per 100 working age adults.
- This is approximately half that of Walsall's Claimant rate (5.3), and over three times lower than the highest ward (Pleck, 8.5)


- Pheasey's occupational profile differs from Walsall in some key areas: employment is higher in Professional Occupations (18.7% contrasted to Walsall's 14.9%), and there are substantially fewer employed in Elementary and Plant/Machinery occupations.
- This indicates the labour force of Pheasey is distributed more towards professional, office-focussed and non-manual occupations, than elsewhere in the borough.

Deprivation



Pheasey ranks very low for deprivation, with all neighbourhoods above the England average.

It ranks positively for lack of deprivation in:

- Income
- Children and Young People
- Crime
- Employment

All within the 7th decile compared to England.

However it does face particular challenges with:

- Indoor (Housing Quality)
- Outdoor (Air Quality, Road Traffic Accidents)

- Pheasey's household population of full-time students and schoolchildren, aged over 5yrs, is 19.1%, slightly below the Walsall figure of 22.1%
- Fewer Single-family households consisting of a lone parent with dependent children, make up 6.4% of Pheasey's households, compared to 8.9% across Walsall
- High number homeowners 85% being owned and of those, more than half are owned outright, without a mortgage or shared ownership. 11% households rent privately or live rent free. Only 4% homes are socially rented, 2nd lowest in Walsall overall (23.7%) compared to Birchills Leamore where over 40% are rented socially
- The number of households living with **no** central heating across the borough has
 positively decreased by about half since 2011. Pheasey has improved from 2.9%
 to 1.3% in the last decade and better than the Walsall figure of 1.6%



Development / Regeneration

- Residential area with easy access to open space and Green Belt.
- Home to Barr Beacon Local Nature Reserve which is a war memorial and includes part of the Black Country UNESCO Global Geopark (site at Pinfold Lane Quarry).
- Home to Great Barr Hall derelict grade II listed property standing in a grade II registered park and garden in Green Belt and Conservation Area. Planning application submitted for a mixed-use scheme refused in February 2022 for a number of reasons including impact on heritage assets. The council has since engaged the landowner.
- Number of local centres providing a range of services: Queslett, Collingwood Drive and Beacon Road.
- Former Three Crowns Public House planning approval for housing on site – demolition completed.
- Many start-up and home-based SMEs are based in the ward, of which the majority are sole traders
- Current planning application for a battery electrical storage site on Chapel Lane – residents have raised concerns.
- Emergence of the Walsall Borough Local Plan may require housing development on Green Belt.






Population Pyramid

Key Points:

- Pheasey Park Farm has the 7th oldest population of Walsall's wards, with around 1 in 5 people over the age of 65, and a median age of 42 years old: approximately 3 years above the Borough average (39 years), and a stark contrast to the youngest wards, Blakenall and Pleck, at 32 years..
- In terms of Population Density, Pheasey Park Farm is the 2nd most sparsely populated ward, equating to just 1,493 people per square km. For context: Walsall's total population density is 2,733, and Willenhall North, Walsall's most crowded ward, has roughly 2 times as many people per sq. km (5,429).
- Ethnically, the ward is predominantly White British (81%), with smaller populations of Asian (11%), Black (3%), Mixed (3%) and Other (2%). These four population groups have all increased since 2011, with the latter two groups doubling in size.






Language and Religion

- 31.6% of residents reported in 2021 Census as having No Religion compared to Walsall overall (30.2%)





Key Points:

- With 92.9% of residents being UK born, Pheasey has the 7th largest proportion of UK born residents of the 20 Walsall wards.
- Pheasey has approximately half the proportion of non-UK born residents (7.1%) when contrasted with the borough's 14.7%.
- There are substantially fewer residents whom were born in the Middle East and Asia, at around 380 residents or approximately 3.3% (Borough = 8%), but this remains the largest origin for non-UK born residents. There are also relatively fewer from EU8 (2004 EU enlargement nations such as Poland, Hungary, Lithuania, Slovenia and Slovakia).
- There are roughly similar levels of EU14 born residents as the rest of the borough: founding EU states such as Germany, France, Italy and Spain, accounting for 1% of the ward's population (114 residents).



Key Points:

- Social Segmentation categorises residential populations by shared socio-economic traits and similar behaviours.
- Pheasey features a wide range of segments, with the largest three being Senior Security, Aspiring Homemakers and Suburban Stability, accounting for 75% of households.
- It is a broad mix of segments covering various life stages: young aspiring homemakers, settled older families and seniors enjoying financially comfortable retirement.
- These segments are generally more financially resilient and able to better weather economic shocks and turmoil than other segments within the Borough.





Children are defined as having reached a good level of development at the end of their Reception year if they have achieved at least the expected level in prime and specific areas of learning.

Maths

The overall GLD for Walsall in 2022 was 59%. 75% of children who reside in the Pheasey Park Farm ward achieved a good level of development, 16% higher than the Walsall average and 10% higher the national average. than Pheasev Park Farm is ranked the highest achieving second compared to other wards in Walsall.







Attainment data by ward is matched based on children resident in the ward who attended any Walsall school within the local authority. Any children who attended an out of borough school are excluded from the analysis.

Pupils take national curriculum assessments in year 6 at the end of KS2, when most will reach the age of 11. Pupils take tests commonly referred to as SATs. A higher proportion of children who reside in the Pheasey Park Farm ward achieve the expected standard at KS2 than both the Walsall and National averages across all core subjects. Achievement in Reading and maths is significantly high at ward level.

At the end of KS4 (Year 11) pupils sit examinations in a range of GCSE and other vocational qualifications

The percentage of pupils in Walsall who have achieved at least a grade 4 or above in English and maths GCSE is slightly below national at 63%. Students resident in the Pheasey Park Farm ward do significantly better with 83% achieving a standard pass at GCSE.

More students who live in the ward achieve a good pass in English and maths GCSE than locally - 24% higher than the Walsall LA figure and 21% higher than the National average.











- 9.7% of residents provide weekly unpaid care, mostly 50-64yrs old and providing less than 19 hours per week








In Pheasey Park Farm around
