






Welcome to Pleck



Did you know?

- **Pleck Park** – Once part of Bescot Hall Estate, the park was created as a memorial to those lost in WW1. The park hosts summer party charity events for families such as ‘Superheroes Assemble’ with stalls, bouncy castles, games and mehndi.
- **Walsall Manor Hospital** is situated in Pleck with a main entrance on Pleck Road. Walsall Healthcare Trust provides the towns NHS acute care and community services. The Pleck road’s £170 million development of the site was completed in 2010, upgrades included state of the art operating theatres.
- **Transport: Pleck Railway Station** – Built on the London & North West line in 1881 in Pleck, the station closed permanently in 1958 and lines are now used for freight only, on Walsall to Wolverhampton line.



- Covers 3.56 sq km (355.9 ha)
- Makes up 3.4% of the total area of Walsall Borough
- Has a population density of 4,541 people per square kilometer







- Pleck's occupational profile differs from Walsall in some key areas: substantially more employed in elementary occupations (19.9%, almost 1 in 5, compared to Walsall's 13.5%), machine operators (15.5%, Walsall 12.6%), and Caring/Leisure (12.4%). A small proportion are employed within professional occupation, administrative, directors, skilled trades and technical occupations.
- This indicates the labour force Pleck is distributed more towards manual and unskilled occupations and industry - factory/plant operators, with relatively fewer office-based administrative, professionals and directors.





- Pleck's qualifications profile is similar to Walsall's but differs with almost 1 in 3 adults (31.6%) having no formal qualifications (Walsall 26.3%), and fewer A Levels/NVQ3 or higher (12.4%, Walsall 15.7%). There are 4.5% of adults with other/international (not recognised) qualifications.

- This is the largest of the 20 Walsall wards, and above the borough rate of 5.3.



Pleck is a highly deprived area, with all neighbourhoods falling within the 20% most deprived areas in England.

Pleck faces particularly high deprivation in:

- **Adult Skills**
 - **Income**
 - **Employment**
 - **Outdoors i.e. Air Quality and Road Accidents**
- All within the 1st decile, or the 10% most deprived areas in England, for those specific domains.

However it does rank positively for:

- **Proximity to Services**
- Within the 7th decile when compared to England.



- Pleck's household population of full-time students and schoolchildren, aged over 5yrs, is 28.2%, above the Walsall figure(22.1%) and twice the number of Pheasey's students.
- High number of Single-family households consisting of a lone parent with dependent children, making up 10.7% of Pleck's households, this is 5th highest in borough and Bloxwich East ward. The number of lone parent households in Pleck is more than double that of Pelsall (279) and three times as many as the number in Streetly (186)
- Lower number of homeowners – 45.6% are owned. Of those, 55% are owned outright, without a mortgage or shared ownership. Pleck has the largest percentage (29%) of households where residents either rent privately or live rent free (Borough 16.5%). One in four homes in Peck are socially rented (25.1%) matching Willenhall South.
- The number of households living with **no** central heating across the borough has positively decreased by about half since 2011. Pleck has the highest proportion of households living without central heating at 2.39%, the Walsall figure is 1.61%. Pleck ward has 132 households living with no central heating, this ranks 3rd in number, just below Darlaston South (133) & St. Matthews (160)

% Households in Ward with no Central heating




Development & Regeneration

- **Walsall Manor Hospital** serves 270,000 residents across Walsall and surrounding areas. Services include the new £40m emergency unit completed and operational since 2023.
- **Birchills and Pleck Local Centres** with multiple independent retailers.
- Existing High Quality Employment Areas including Walsall Enterprise Park and supporting **strategic companies** including Fortel, Superior Sections, Promat, Perfection Foods, Joseph Ash Galvanising & Anochrome. Network Rail Training Centre is also Network Rail's largest workforce development centre.
- **Black Country Enterprise Zone** – Darlaston sites – strategic employment development land, including SPARK, Parallel 113, Tempus 10, Box Pool and former Gasholders sites.
- Strategic **transport improvements** including the £78m M6 Junction 10 works nearing completion and completed £26m Darlaston Access Project to help reduce congestion and travel times on highways network.
- **Walking and cycling improvements** along the canal towpath.
- Narrow Lane temporary transit site for Gypsy, Roma and Traveller communities.
- Part of the **Walsall Town Deal** area with multiple projects totalling £21.3m in progress.
- Remediation and redevelopment of the **SPARK** site is well underway- this is the largest employment opportunity site in the borough and will deliver up to 620,000sqft floorspace and 1100 new jobs.
- Continued support and development of the balance of the **Black Country Enterprise Zone** sites including Tempus 10 North (planning application under assessment), Tempus 10 South (reserved matters consent) and former Gasholders.
- Residential development opportunities as part of the **Walsall Gateway**. The former Harvestime Bakery site within Walsall Gateway is completed and occupied.






Population Pyramid

Key Points:

- Pleck has the 3rd youngest population of Walsall's wards, with around 1 in 4 people aged 0-15yrs, and a median age of 32 years old, 7 years below the Borough average (39 years). This is a stark contrast to Walsall's oldest ward, Aldridge Central & South, at 48 years. Pleck has lower populations of residents aged over 50yrs than Walsall.
- In terms of Population Density, Pleck is the 4th most densely populated ward, equating to 4,541 people per sq km. For context: Walsall's density is 2,733, and Aldridge Central & South, Walsall's least crowded ward, has 1000 people per sq. km.
- Ethnically, the ward has growing populations of Asian (49%), Black (9%) and Other Ethnic Groups (4%), with a reduction seen in White population of 10% in the last decade (34%). The Mixed or Multiple Ethnic group also reduced by 1% since 2011.




Population by Religion



- 81.1% of households have all or at least one adult where English is the main language, matching Palfrey as lowest in borough and compared to 99.3% of Pelsall households. When English is not the main spoken language in the home, 31% of these residents cannot speak English or cannot speak it well.
- Pleck has the highest proportion of non-English speakers in households (788) 14.2% of all households in the ward, compared to only 0.5% in Pelsall (26).


40% household residents are **Muslim** (Borough 11%)

- Pleck ward has a majority population of Muslim residents (39.9%). This is much higher than the Walsall borough percentage of 11.3%. It has the second lowest proportion of Christians in the borough (29.6%) The Hindu population of 4.2% is also higher than Walsall at 1.8%
- Only 14.2% of Pleck residents reported in 2021 Census as having No Religion, compared to Walsall (30.2%) and Brownhills(41%), Walsall's least religious ward.


Global Map of Non-UK Born Residents by Area of Birth

Key Points:



- With 64.9% of residents being UK born, Pleck has the largest proportion of non-UK born residents of the 20 Walsall wards.
- It has substantially more non-UK born residents, at 35.1% of the population, when contrasted with the borough's 14.7%.
- The largest area of non-UK birth is Middle East and Asia, at around 3,423 residents or approximately 21.2% (Borough 7.9%) – and the second largest of the 20 Walsall wards.
- Whilst Palfrey's Middle East and Asian born population is larger (24.2%), Pleck's non-UK born population is the most diverse of the wards, with relatively more born in other areas of the world. African born comprises 4.9% of the population (Walsall 1.94%), approximately 784 residents.
- EU areas of birth are similarly higher: 2.6% EU8 (2004 EU enlargement nations such as Poland, Hungary, Lithuania, Slovenia and Slovakia), 2.5% EU14 nations (founding EU states such as Germany, France, Italy and Spain) and 2.5% from EU2 nations (Bulgaria and Romania).




Social Segment Composition of Walsall Wards (% Households)



Key Points:

- Social Segmentation is a means of categorising residential populations by shared socio-economic traits and similar behaviours.
- Pleck features a range of segments, **Urban Cohesion** is the largest, followed by **Family Basics** and **Vintage Value**. These are defined on the right of this page.
- 27% of Pleck's households could be described as **Urban Cohesion**: diverse urban communities, with a strong sense of identity, making much use of online services, leisure and information. This segment is relatively more resilient to economic shock than others in Palfrey.
- Family Basics** and **Vintage Value** (a combined 37% of households), are segments that, whilst experiencing different life-stages, face similarly constrained incomes and limited educations. They have potential to experience fuel poverty and are susceptible to economic turmoil/crises.





Key Points:

Attainment data by ward is matched based on children resident in the ward who attended any Walsall school within the local authority. Any children who attended an out of borough school are excluded from the analysis.

Pupils take national curriculum assessments in year 6 at the end of KS2, when most will reach the age of 11. Pupils take tests commonly referred to as SATs.

A lower proportion of children who reside in the **Pleck** ward achieve the expected standard at KS2 compared to Walsall and National averages across all core subjects. Pupils perform highest in Reading.

At the end of KS4 (Year 11) pupils sit examinations in a range of GCSE and other vocational qualifications

The percentage of pupils in Walsall who have achieved at least a grade 4 or above in English and maths GCSE is slightly below national at 63%. Students' resident in the **Pleck** ward do less well with 56% achieving a standard pass at GCSE.

41% of students who live in the ward achieve a good pass in English and maths GCSE. This is slightly below the Walsall LA average by 3% and 6% below the National average.

% Children who reached a good level of development in 2022



Children are defined as having reached a good level of development at the end of their Reception year if they have achieved at least the expected level in prime and specific areas of learning.


The overall GLD for Walsall in 2022 was 59%. 44% of children who reside in the **Pleck** ward achieved a good level of development – 15% lower than the LA average and 21% below the national average. **Pleck** is ranked the lowest achieving ward in Walsall.

% Standard pass Grade 4-9




Council Tax Reduction (CTR) household claimants – working age



- 78.8% of Pleck's residents rated their general health as being good or better, ranking 9th highest of the Walsall wards, albeit lower than England average of 82.1%.
- At 6.8%, approximately 1 in 15 residents rated their health as bad or worse.








Prevalence of Overweight and Obesity in Reception Year





Prevalence of Overweight and Obesity in Year 6




The prevalence of Year 6 children who are overweight or obese in Pleck has increased sharply in recent years and is also significantly higher than both the Walsall average and the national rate.







How satisfied or dissatisfied are you with the care and support services you receive?




Do care and support services help you to have a better quality of life?




