Did you know?

- **Transport History** Currently situated at Black Country Living Museum, 'Birchills' is the name given to a historic 'Joey' boat with a small day cabin built in 1953 by Ernest Thomas of Walsall. 'Birchills' was one of the last wooden day boats made and was used to carry coal to Birchills Power Station and Wolverhampton Power Station. It is the only surviving 'Joey' with a day cabin. The power station was opened in the north of Birchills in 1949, just a few years before the Beechdale council estate was developed at the far side. This power station served the Walsall area for 33 years until its closure in October 1982, and was demolished in March 1987. The site of the power station was redeveloped for housing and commerce during the 1990's.
- Famous Beechdale Resident Neville 'Noddy' Holder MBE was born in Caldmore, in 1946 but his family moved to Birchills Leamore and he grew up on the Beechdale estate from the age of 7yrs old. Lead vocalist, guitarist and songwriter of 'Slade' one of the most successful rock acts of the 1970's and he co-wrote the famous hit "Merry Christmas Everybody".
- **Pouk Hill** Located in Birchills, the hill inspired a 1970s Slade song of the same name. The cover photograph of the band's first album, 'Beginnings', was taken on the hill in mid-winter snow.
- Walsall Arena and Arts Centre Based in Leamore and seen as one of the most technically advanced venues in the West Midlands, it is a multi-purpose performance space hosting a variety of theatre, comedy, dance, drama and digital arts.







 Almost 1 in 3 (31.5%) Birchills Leamore adults have no formal qualifications: higher than the Walsall borough (26.3%, approx. 1 in 4), and fewer have a degree or higher (19.3%). The proportion of those with GCSEs, apprenticeships or A Levels closely matches the borough.



- Birchills Leamore's occupational profile features relatively high employment in Elementary Occupations (manual, unskilled labour 19.5% of the workforce) and machine operatives (13.9%), compared to the wider borough. There are relatively fewer professional occupations: only 9.6% of the workforce, contrasting with Walsall's 14.9%.
- This indicates the labour force of Birchills Leamore is distributed more towards manual and factory-based/machine occupations, with proportionately fewer professionals than Walsall.



- Birchills Leamore's Claimant Count (Jobseekers Allowance) is 7.6 per 100 working age adults.
- This is the third highest ward and above the borough rate (5.3 per 100 working age adults).

Deprivation



Birchills Leamore is predominantly comprised of high deprivation areas, with most of its neighbourhoods falling within the 20% most deprived areas in England (decile 1-2).

It faces particular deprivation challenges with:

- Adult Skills (decile 1)
- Older people (decile 1)
- Education, Skills and Training (decile 1)
- Children (decile 1)
- Income (decile 1)

However it ranks positively for close **proximity to services**, falling within the 7th decile of England areas.




- Birchills Leamore's household population of full-time students and schoolchildren, aged over 5yrs, is 24.3%, above Walsall figure (22.1%) with numbers similar to St' Matthews.
- Single-family households consisting of a lone parent with dependent children, make up 12.2% of households, with similar high percentage to Bentley & Darlaston North (13.%). The number of lone parent households in Birchills Leamore is 3rd highest in Walsall, below wards of Blakenall (829) and Darlaston South with the highest number (905).
- Birchills Leamore has the *Lowest of number of homeowners* 38.8% are owned. Of those, 51% are owned outright, without a mortgage or shared ownership.
- 20% of households rent privately or live rent free.
- 40.7% of homes in Birchills Leamore are socially rented (2576), with similar numbers to Darlaston South (2,432) This is the highest in Walsall (Borough 23.7%) and ten times that of Paddock ward, where only 4.0% of homes are rented socially.
- Birchills Leamore has very similar percentage of households living with no central heating as Palfrey, equating to 1.93% of the ward's total households. This is worse than the Walsall figure of 1.61% households living with *no central heating*. The number of homes without central heating in Birchills Leamore (122) is *twice as many as Brownhills* (61).

Development & Regeneration

- Home to several strategic businesses including TJX Europe, Homeserve plc, South Staffs Water, Babcock International Group, Genex UK Ltd, A. F. Blakemore (branch), Chamberlin & Hill (branch).
- Development of Reedswood Business Park and Focus 10 providing new high quality employment space. Expansion of British Car Auctions.
- Residential schemes including Innovation Way by Accord (now GreenSquareAccord) 120 homes designed and constructed by LoCal Homes. Sites of the former Caparo and Metafin industries currently under construction. Multiple housing providers operate in the area-WATMOS, GreenSquareAccord, Beechdale Community Housing (Longhurst Group), whg.
- Green Flag Award winning Reedswood Park providing play and outdoor leisure activities.
 Rough Wood Nature Reserve includes pools which provides for fishing and nature trails.
- Transport and connectivity improvements- A34 North Red Route, Chase Line Rail Electrification, canal towpath, M6 Jct10.
- Part of the **Bloxwich and Walsall Town Deal** areas with multiple projects totalling £21.3million in each area in progress.
- Purpose-built Walsall Energy-from-Waste facility to commence construction in early 2024, located Fryers Road.
- The demolished former Green Lane Police Station site has planning consent for the development of 130 new apartments.
- Proposed new Free School for secondary education has been approved for Walsall by the DfE. Exploratory work is underway of the former Reedswood Golfcourse site to test suitability and feasibility for the school.
- LidI has announced it is set to close its warehouse distribution facility at Newfield Close in the next 12 months. The future of the site is to be clarified.







Population Pyramid









Key Points:

- Birchills and Leamore has one of the younger populations of Walsall's wards, with only around 1 in 8 people being over the age of 65yrs. The ward has a median age of 34 years old, 5 years below the Borough average (39 years). There is a higher population of babies and pre-schoolers aged 0-4yrs compared to Walsall overall, particularly in females.
- The Population Density of Birchills Leamore equates to 3,478 people per sq. km. This is guite similar to that of Bloxwich East Ward (3,469 per sg.km) and just over double that of Aldridge North and Walsall Wood, with only 1,676 people per sq.km.
 - Ethnically, in Birchills Leamore, the White British Group has decreased by 8%, with growing populations of Asian (16%), Black (7%), and Other (2%). These have all increased since 2011, with the Black group doubling in percentage. Walsall Council Data Source: Census 2021







43% Household residents identified as Christian (Walsall Borough Christian - 45%)

- Birchills Leamore ward has less than half (43.2%) of residents identifying with Christian religion. This is lower the Walsall borough percentage of 45%. It also has a higher proportion of residents from Muslim communities (13.1%) compared to Walsall's 11.3% of Muslim residents.
 - 34.3% of Birchills Leamore residents reported in 2021 Census as having No Religion, matching Aldridge North & Walsall Wood as the median for the Borough





 92.6% of households in Birchills Leamore have all *or* at least one adult where English is spoken as the main language, compared to 81.1% in Palfrey and Pleck. When English is not the main spoken language in the household, 29% of these residents either cannot speak English or cannot speak English well.

• Birchills Leamore has 366 Households where no residents speak English as the main language, this is 5.8% of the Ward's households and closest to the percentage seen in Darlaston South Ward (which equates to 6.3% of the ward).

Birchills Leamore versus Borough Comparison

 With 83.9% of residents being UK born, Birchills Leamore has the 12th largest proportion of UK born residents of the 20 Walsall wards.

- At approximately 16.1%, almost 1 in 6 of Birchills Leamore's residents were born outside of the UK, which is slightly above the borough's 14.7%.
- The largest area or non-UK birth is the Middle East and Asia, at around 1,115 residents or approximately 7% (Walsall 8%). There are also proportionately more residents whom were born in Africa (2.9%) and EU8, at 2.5% (2004 EU enlargement nations such as Poland, Hungary, Lithuania, Slovenia and Slovakia).
- Whilst relatively small in number, there are proportionately more EU14 born residents as the rest of the borough: founding EU states such as Germany, France, Italy and Spain, accounting for 1.6% of the ward's population, and EU2 (Bulgaria, Romania) at 1.1%.




Social Segmentation

Key Points:



- Social Segmentation is a means of categorising residential populations by shared socio-economic traits and similar behaviours.
- Birchills Leamore features a wide range of segments, with the largest three being Family Basics, Municipal Tenants and Vintage Value. These are defined on the right of this page.
- **Family Basics** accounts for almost a quarter of households: low earning families with limited education, multiple children, poorer quality housing, and little disposable income. It is a segment highly vulnerable to economic shock/crises i.e. fuel/energy, high inflation.
- Typical traits of the majority of households in this ward are low income, limited discretionary income and potential for fuel poverty.





Key Points:

Attainment data by ward is matched based on children resident in the ward who attended any Walsall school within the local authority. Any children who attended an out of borough school are excluded from the analysis.

Pupils take national curriculum assessments in year 6 at the end of KS2, when most will reach the age of 11. Pupils take tests commonly referred to as SATs. A lower proportion of children in the Birchills and Leamore ward achieved the expected standard when compared to the Walsall and National average. The biggest percentage gap shown is in Writing.

At the end of KS4 (Year 11) pupils sit examinations in a range of GCSE and other vocational qualifications.


The percentage of pupils in Walsall who have achieved at least a grade 4 or above in English and maths GCSE is slightly below national at 63%. Just under half (49%) of students' resident in the Birchills and Leamore ward achieved a standard pass at GCSE.

32% of students who live in the ward achieved a good pass in English and maths GCSE. This is 12% lower than the Walsall LA figure and 15% lower than the National average.

Council Tax Reduction (CTR) household claimants – working age





- Birchills Leamore residents report their general level of health as 2nd poorest in borough, with 8.2% being rated Bad or Worse. Only 76.4% residents rate their general health Good or Better, which is lower than the England average of 82.1%.
- Approximately 1 in 12 residents reported living in poor health or worse.



Prevalence of Overweight and Obesity in Reception Year




Prevalence of Overweight and Obesity in Year 6


Weight category of children by ward








