Did you know?

- History Darlaston was subject to a number of bombing raids in World War II. A Luftwaffe bombing on 5 June 1941 wrecked several council houses in Lowe Avenue, Rough Hay, and killed 11 people. The bomb had been aimed at Rubery Owen's factory but missed by some distance. The houses were later rebuilt. In 1999, a council house on the New Moxley housing estate collapsed down a disused mineshaft, its occupant, an elderly man had complained of creaking and groaning in the house to neighbours who alerted the authorities. They in turn instructed him to leave and few hours later it collapsed down the mine.
- **Resident Artists** Thomas F. Worrall a watercolourist and his brother William Worrall a pottery and fabric designer, lived in the industrialised Woods Bank area of Darlaston where their father was a blacksmith in the 1870's.
- **Parks and Nature** Moorcroft Wood is a local Nature reserve, in July 2020 it was announced that it was granted UNESCO Global Geopark status due to its mining history and large slag deposits from the Moorcroft Iron works. The habitat of wildlife include bats and water scorpians.






Darlaston South Assets Map






- Darlaston South's occupational profile differs from Walsall's with a greater proportion of the workforce employed in elementary (manual) occupations (17.1%, Walsall 13.5%), factory/plant operatives (13.3%, Walsall 10.6%), and fewer professional occupations (10.4%, Walsall 14.9%).
- This indicates the labour force of Darlaston South is distributed relatively more towards manual labour than potentially office-based, professional occupations, compared to Walsall.

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Deprivation



Darlaston South is a highly deprived ward, with majority of its population residing in areas which fall within the 20% most deprived areas in England (decile 1-2).

It faces particular deprivation challenges with:

- Adult Skills (decile 1)
- Children and Older People (decile 1)
- Income (decile 1)
- Education, Skills and Training (decile 1)
- **Employment** (decile 3)

It ranks positively for **proximity to services**, falling within the 7th decile of England areas.



- Darlaston South's household population of full-time students and school children, aged over 5yrs, is 25.7% - above the Walsall figure of 22.1% and ranks 5th highest in Walsall.
- Single-family households, consisting of a lone parent with dependent children, make up 13.7% of Darlaston South households, ranking second highest in Walsall below Blakenall. The number of lone parent households is highest in the Borough (905), compared to Willenhall South (703) which has a similar population but has more households overall.
- Darlaston South ranks 4th fewest number of homeowners 44% are owned. Of those, less than half (47%) are owned outright, without a mortgage or shared ownership. 18% of households rent privately or live rent free. 37% of households in Darlaston South are socially rented, with similar numbers to St. Matthew's ward. This is higher than Walsall overall (23.7%) and ranks third highest in the borough.
- Darlaston South has very similar number of households (133) living without central heating, as Pleck (132). This equates to 2.01% of Darlaston South's total households. This is better compared with 2.39% of households in Pleck ward, but worse than the Walsall Borough figure at 1.61% of households living with *no* central heating. Darlaston has twice as many homes without central heating than Aldridge Central & South (67).

Development & Regeneration

- Darlaston District Centre with anchor retailer- Asda and multiple independents.
- Moxley Local Centre Moxley People Centre and anchor retailer- Aldi.
- Strategic residential developments, including Oak Hill Mews, Hemlock Way, Wards Keep, Curtin Drive and John Wooton House.
- High Quality Employment Areas including Bullseye Industrial Park and supporting Strategic Companies including Toolbank, DFS distribution and Alucast.
- Access to M6 Jct 10 and strategic network via the Black Country New Road & Black Country Route.
- Bradley Lane metro station (the only metro station in Walsall) and park & ride facility.
- Open space assets at George Rose Park, Kings Hills Park, Great Bridge Road playing fields, and Moorcroft Wood Local Nature Reserve.
- Improved canal corridor and towpaths
- £20m funding award for the Darlaston Long Term Plan for Towns to be delivered over 10 years as part of the governments Levelling Up programme. Community driven priorities focused on safety & security; high streets, heritage & regeneration; and transport & connectivity.
- Residential site opportunities at Joynson Street and Rowley View.
- Strategic employment development opportunity at **Iron Park** that has the potential deliver circa 470,000sqft floorspace (subject to grant funding requirements).
- Council works to provide continued support to businesses/landowners with regard to their development requirements and growth aspirations





Population Pyramid


Census 2021, population age and sex

Key Points:

Darlaston South has the 2nd youngest population in Walsall, with around 1 in 4 people under 16yrs old, and 60% of the ward is aged under 40yrs old. Darlaston South has a median age of 33 years old, the same as Palfrey. This is 15yrs below Aldridge Central & South, Walsall's oldest ward, which has a median age of 48years.




Willenhall North

- The population change in Darlaston South has seen the biggest growth in Walsall, with a 20.3% increase since 2011. It has the largest population and density is now second highest in borough at 4,809 people per sq.km. In Context, Walsall's density is 2,733, per sq. km and in contrast to Aldridge Central & South (1,000 per Sq. km).
- Ethnically, the White British group has decreased since 2011 by 10%, (72%), with growing populations of Asian (15%), Black (6%), Mixed (5%) and Other (1%). These populations have all increased since 2011, with the numbers of Other group tripling.



Language and Religion

- 91.4% of households in Darlaston South have all *or* at least one adult where English is spoken as the main language, compared to 81.1% in Palfrey and Pleck. When English is not the main spoken language in the household, 26% of these residents either cannot speak English or cannot speak English well.
- Darlaston South has 418 Households where nobody speaks English as the main language. This is 6.3% of the ward, and over three times as many as the 109 households in Willenhall North, which equates to only 2.2% of the ward.
- Darlaston South ward has 43.0% of residents following a Christian religion. This is lower than the Walsall percentage of 45%. It has highest number and proportion of residents with 'Other' Religion in the borough. It also has a slightly higher proportion of Hindu residents (2.1%) when compared to Walsall's 1.8% of Hindus.
- 36.2% of Darlaston South residents reported in 2021 Census as having No Religion, on par with Rushall-Shelfield, and ranking 4th least religious ward. This is high when compared to Palfrey ward, with just 11.1% of ward not following any religion.

Key Points:

- With 83.4% of residents being UK born, Darlaston South has the 13th largest proportion of UK born residents of the 20 Walsall wards.
- 16.6% of Darlaston South's population originates from non-UK nations, which is slightly above the wider borough's 14.7%.
- The largest non-UK born areas are the Middle East and Asia, at around 1,116 residents or approximately 6.5% (Borough 8%).
- There are proportionately more residents whom were born in EU8 countries (2004 EU enlargement nations such as Poland, Hungary, Lithuania, Slovenia and Slovakia), at 4.2% of the population: more than double the borough's 1.9%, indicating an emergent communities.
- African born residents are the third largest non-UK area of birth, at 2.2% of the population.



Key Points:

- Social Segmentation is a means of categorising residential populations by shared socio-economic traits and similar behaviours.
- Darlaston South features a range of segments but is less diverse than other wards, with the largest segment being **Family Basics**, followed by smaller proportion of **Modest Traditions** and **Vintage Value**. These are defined on the right of this page.
- Family Basics accounts for 41% of households: low earning families with limited education, multiple children, poorer quality housing, and little disposable income. It is a segment highly vulnerable to economic shock/crises i.e. fuel/energy, high inflation
- Typical traits of the majority of households in this ward are low income, limited discretionary income and potential for fuel poverty.

Key Points:

Attainment data by ward is matched based on children resident in the ward who attended any Walsall school within the local authority. Any children who attended an out of borough school are excluded from the analysis.

Pupils take national curriculum assessments in year 6 at the end of KS2, when most will reach the age of 11. Pupils take tests commonly referred to as SATs. The percentage of children in the Darlaston South ward who reached the expected standard is lower than the Walsall and National averages across all


core subjects.

At the end of KS4 (Year 11) pupils sit examinations in a range of GCSE and other vocational qualifications.

The percentage of pupils in Walsall who have achieved at least a grade 4 or above in English and maths GCSE is slightly below national at 63%. 59% of students' resident in the Darlaston South ward do achieve a standard pass at GCSE.

36% of students who live in the ward achieve a good pass in English and maths GCSE-8% lower than the Walsall LA figure and 11% lower than the National average.

% Children who reached a good level of development in 2022



Children are defined as having reached a good level of development at the end of their Reception year if they have achieved at least the expected level in prime and specific areas of learning.

The GLD percentage based on children who reside in the Darlaston South ward matches the Walsall average of 59% but is below the national average. Darlaston South ward is ranked 9th highest achieving ward in Walsall.




Achieving GCSE English and maths in 2022







Child Healthy Weight



The prevalence of Year 6 children who are overweight or obese in Darlaston South has shown a stable trend and is still significantly higher than both the Walsall average and the national rate.






Overall, in Darlaston South, just under
