Welcome to St. Matthew's









Did you know?

- **History** In 1900, approximately 10,000 people were employed locally in the preparation of leather and making saddles and bridles. It's estimated there are at least 40 manufacturers of saddles, bridles and light leather goods in the town today. Walsall Leather Museum, opened by princess Anne in 1988, tells the story of the leather trade in Walsall, charting the towns rise from small market town to the international saddle making centre.
- Queen Elizabeth's Platinum Jubilee Opening Sketch showed her having tea with Paddington Bear, in which she produced a marmalade sandwich 'for later' from her leather handbag. One of her favourite Launer London handbag designs was the Traviata, which is handmade in Walsall!
- **Arts** The New Art Gallery opened in 2000, including works from Epstein, Van Gough & Monet. Lifts use the voice of Noddy Holder MBE (Musician) to announce floor arrivals. In partnership with the James Brindley Foundation, Walsall Gallery Square will be host to the 'Knife Angel' Sculpture, a symbol of unity against knife crime, in December 2023. Walsall Illuminations ran from 1951-2009 attracting 250,000 tourists in 1995.
- **People** Dorothy Pattison, a nurse known as Sister Dora, arrived in Walsall in 1865. She treated thousands of patients when the town was hit with smallpox. Walsall Manor hospital's Sister Dora outpatients and Dorothy Pattison Hospital caring for mental health patients, are both named after her in dedication.
- Landmarks St Matthews Church rebuilt in 1820, had a stained-glass window dedicated to Sister Dora in 1882 and in 1886 a statue marking her legacy was unveiled in the town centre. In 1972 'Hoppy' the Hippopotamus, a locally famous statue, was commissioned by Walsall Council - but to this day the reason why remains a mystery!







 St. Matthew's has a substantially higher proportion of degree or higher educated residents (30.7% of the population), but for other qualifications it matches the Borough picture. Almost 1 in 4, 23.5%, have no gualification (Walsall 26.3%).

- St. Matthew's Claimant **Count (Jobseekers** Allowance) is relatively high, at 7.7 per 100 working age adults.
- This is the 2nd highest of the 20 Walsall wards and exceeds the Borough Claimant rate (5.3).


- St. Matthew's occupational profile broadly mirrors Walsall as a borough, with a major exception that relatively more residents are employed within professional occupations (19.6%), and fewer within Skilled Trades (8.1%).
- The profile indicates the labour force of St. Matthews is very diverse: largest groups being Professionals (highly qualified, office-based) alongside relatively large elementary occupations (manual, routine tasks).

- Indoors i.e. Housing Quality



Housing & Households



614 (8.7%) St. Matthew's Households are Lone Parents of Dependent children

- St. Matthew's household population of full-time students and school children, aged over 5yrs, is 22.9%: the same as Willenhall South and just above Walsall (22.1%).
- 614 households consist of a lone parent with dependent children, which is double the number compared to 301 in Pheasey. This makes up 8.7% of St. Matthew's households, on par with Walsall and compares to 14.5% in Blakenall.
- The 2nd lowest number of homeowners in Walsall: 40% are owned and of those, more than half are owned outright, without a mortgage or shared ownership. 27% households rent privately or live rent free. One third of homes are socially rented, this ranks 6th highest in Walsall and compares to only 2% in Streetly.
- Number of households living with **no central heating** across the borough has positively decreased by about half since 2011. However, St. Matthew's has the second highest number of households (2.3%) of the Walsall wards and is within the top quintile of those living with no heating, compared to only 0.9% in Streetly (Walsall borough is 1.6%).





Development / Regeneration


- Includes Walsall Town Centre, one of the strategic centres in the Black Country a major focus for retail, office, leisure and cultural activities.
- Walsall Town Centre benefits from its own planning framework including the Town Centre Action Plan (AAP) adopted in 2019. The Town Centre Masterplan approved in 2019 sets out 20-year vision for the transformation of the town centre.
- Significant town centre development and investment in the last 15 years >£425m delivering over 85,000sqm of floorspace across a variety of uses, examples include Walsall Waterfront, Wisemore (Travelodge) and Walsall College.
- · A significant part of the ward is greenbelt and includes affluent residential areas in the east of the ward.
- Further significant investment (circa £62million) planned for Walsall Town Centre in rail and bus infrastructure, public realm and in heritage buildings, through Walsall Connected Gateway, Active Public Spaces and Creative Industries projects, which are funded through Walsall Council, Town Deal and Future High Street Fund programmes. Such projects will implement the early phases of Walsall Town Centre Masterplan.
- Delivery of Bus Rapid Transit scheme known as **SPRINT** into Walsall Town Centre is proposed, enhancing links between Walsall and Birmingham City Centre.
- Aspirations to deliver significant Town Centre Living opportunities continue to be pursued with pre-development activity on housing led initiatives at Station Street, Saddlers Quay and Walsall Gateway.
- Emergence of Walsall Borough Local Plan is likely to require sites to be allocated for future development within the St Matthews Ward.
- Council works to provide continued support to businesses/landowners in the ward with ٠ regard to their development requirements and growth aspirations.







Key Points


- St. Matthew's has just below the average number of 0-15yr olds in Walsall, with around 1 in 5 under the age of 15yrs. It is a relatively young ward with a median age of 35 years old: approximately 4 years below the borough average (39 years) and a stark contrast to the oldest wards, Aldridge, Streetly and Pelsall (47-48 years).
- In terms of Population Density, St. Matthew's is the 9th least densely populated of the 20 wards, equating to 2,991 people per sq km. For context: Walsall's density is 2,733 and Willenhall North, Walsall's most crowded ward, has almost twice as many people per sq km (5,429). Since 2011, St. Matthew's experienced the 3rd highest increase in population size, growing by 12.5% compared to 5.5% in Walsall.
- Ethnically, St. Matthew's is comprised of 50% White British with large populations of Asian (33%), Black (9%), Mixed (5%) and Other (3%). Asian and Black populations have both increased since 2011, and whilst the smallest group, 'Other' has tripled in size in the last decade.




- 86.5% Households have all occupants, or at least one adult, with English as main language compared to 98.8% in Aldridge & Walsall Wood. When English is not the main spoken language, 31% of residents cannot speak English or cannot speak it well: ranking second highest to Palfrey (35%) and almost double that in Rushall (17%).
- 11.4% of households have nobody with English as main language compared to 0.5% in Pelsall, placing St. Matthew's as the 3rd highest ward in Walsall.

25% households are Muslim (Borough 11.3%)

- 1 in 4 residents reported their religion as Muslim.
- The proportion of Muslim residents in St. Matthew's population is more than double the percentage overall across Walsall 11.3%.
- 23.6% of residents reported in 2021 Census as having no religion.

- The largest non-UK countries of birth are from the Middle East and Asia, approximating 2,283 residents (13.5% of the population), compared to 7.7% across the wider borough.
- The next largest non-UK origins of birth are African nations and EU8 (2004 EU enlargement nations such as Poland, Hungary, Lithuania, Slovenia and Slovakia) at 4% and 3.8% of the population (679 and 648 residents), respectively.
- There are virtually the same level of non-UK born residents from EU2 (Bulgarian and Romania) as there are EU14 born residents (founding EU states such as Germany, France, Italy and Spain), both at 3.8% of the population (approximately 412 and 415 respectively).




Social Segmentation

Key Points:



- Social Segmentation is a means of categorising residential populations by shared socio-economic traits and similar behaviours.
- St. Matthew's has a remarkably different composition than the wider borough, comprised of mostly urban segments: the three largest being Municipal Tenants, Rental Hubs and Transient Renters.
- Municipal Tenants (1 in 5 residences), tend to be very low-income families, with limited formal education, in crowded flats/apartments or social housing, and experiencing high levels of fuel poverty.
- Almost 1 in 3 residences (31.4%) in the ward house typically younger renters/home sharers, with short term leases, whose residence may be transitory/relocate fairly frequently. They make extensive use of social networking and digital services.





Achieving GCSE English and maths in 2022

Children are defined as having reached a good level of development at the end of their Reception year if they have achieved at least the expected level in prime and specific areas of learning.

The overall GLD for Walsall in 2022 was 59%. Achievement of children in the St Matthews ward equalled the Walsall average but is below the national average. St Matthews ward is ranked 10th highest for % GLD compared to the other wards in Walsall.





Key Points:

Attainment data by ward is matched based on children resident in the ward who attended any Walsall school within the local authority. Any children who attended an out of borough school are excluded from the analysis.

Pupils take national curriculum assessments in year 6 at the end of KS2, when most will reach the age of 11. Pupils take tests commonly referred to as SATs. The proportion of children in the St Matthews ward who reached the expected standard equals the Walsall average in Reading and math.

At the end of KS4 (Year 11) pupils sit examinations in a range of GCSE and other vocational qualifications.

The percentage of pupils in Walsall who have achieved at least a grade 4 or above in English and maths GCSE is slightly below national at 63%. 61% of students resident in the St Matthews ward achieve a standard pass at GCSE.

47% of students who live in the ward achieve a good pass in English and maths GCSE. This is 3% higher than the Walsall LA figure and equals the National average.





- St. Matthew's residents report their general level of health favourably, with 78.8% reporting good health and ranking jointly with Pleck as median of the Walsall wards. However, this is lower than the England average (82.1%).
- Approximately 1 in 14 residents reported living in poor health or worse.

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Disability Census 2021, resident population





Prevalence of Overweight and Obesity in Reception Year





● England ● St Matthew's ● Walsall




The prevalence of Year 6 children who are overweight or obese in St. Matthew's has increased in the most recent year and is higher than the national rate, but lower than the average for the borough.


In Reception aged children in this ward, a significantly higher proportion of boys are of a healthy weight than girls.






